The Craze For Automobiles.
(N. O. Dailey States)

From all accounts the growth of he automobile trade throughou the Southwest has resulted in propagating borrowing even to the extent of mortgaging homes, and he matter has become so serious that bauhars in the territory adja cent to St . Louis are viewing the situation with cousiderable alarm Recently a St. Louis brokerag tirm seut a letter of inquiry to 350 baukers in the Middle West, the Sonth and Southwest asking if the purchasing of automobiles in their sections was by persons who pay cash or by persous who bough with borrowed money on time pay

It seems that almost every on of the bankers to whom this letter was sent expressed himself terms of condemnation agninst the purchase of automobiles by persons who could not afford thom. A bauker of Cape Girardean, Mo declared that the number of auto mobiles had increased 300 pe cent during the last year, and with in the last six months only 50 pe cent were paid for by persous able to maintain them. Little Rock, drk., Las gone crazy ou the auto mobile question, aud we are told that it has as many people who have bought the machines withou being able to own them as an city of its size in the conutry, and one-half of them were bought on borrowed fuuds or credit.
A bauker writing from Moulton, Tex., says some persous there hav spent the last dollar of their sav ings for years, and borrowed th balance, to make payments on au tomobiles. Quite a number u

the busiuess is a menace to the prosperity of the country and very soon the brokerage and banking houses will be compelled to tak notice of it.

The lowa Dragged Road.
A few years ago the State of lowa expended five milliou of dolars annually on its roads withou satisfactory results because of ack of system and supervision by the towuship officers. But a bright young man named Eichinger, who as the news editor of the Des Moines Capital, conceived the ide hat the bad roads were due to human foolishuess and ivefficiency and that good roads could be had almost for uothing in place of the bad ones that were costing five willions a year, provided the peo ple could be induced to work toether intelligently.
Eichinger succeeded in arous ug public interest in the matter with the result that Iowa today has one road 380 miles long, from Daveuport, on the west bank of the Mississippi, to Council Bluffs on the east bank of the Missouri his road was made by the people of the towns through which it passes, with the help of the coun$y$ authorities, but without any public appropriation. The sysoun devised by Eichinger affords what is known as a dragges road hich is well-surfaced highway properly crowned without holes or ruts and which is not iujured by
It appears that the principle of the dragged road is to smooth the top surface ang to eliminate the rats and holes in order to prevent softening the bed cf the roadway. We are told that the best time to use the drag is soon after a rain when the ground is soft. It may be dragged with exellent results even when the surface is slushy or the mud when smoothed over is soon dried by the wind and ba but a small portion of dirt to the conter at each trip, and this proess kept up for a few season produces a nicely rounded top surface baked dirt which becomes so hard that it is pructically impervous to water, uuless permitted to stand and soaked for a considerable ougth of time. The ordinary rainall that strikes that surface of the ing way merely rolls away to the side ditches without doing any damage.

The process of making a road y the use of the drag cannut be accessfully applied to steep hills, ot throughout a very large par of Lonisiana, where the ground is evel, the Iowa method can be used to secure greatly improved highways at comparatively sligh expense.
