of the large cane orops of the large cana orops which
boing raiesd in this section.
With our present crop, wo are fooling uneasy and the plantore are all complaining of the slownese of the haudling of the cane, which make it more expenaive to the cane growere.
Upon inquiries we have found that the railroado and boate are not the cause of this, the lack of oars sud boats is due to the fact that the refinerios are gottiug more cane than they cau griud, and soue of the refinerites will take any cave not contracted for.
Grinding will suroly go up t the first daye of January which is too late, planters must get thoi crop out of the field for the last daye of December iu order to allow the atock to reat a fom daya duriug the holidays before start ibg work on the uext crop. The nork on the uext crop will be larger io acreage, and with as favorable weather condition as thie year, what will we do with the crop.
More refinuries are needed or we must not incroase the acroago. Our people believe that we should make all crope we can, which is the correct riew, wo must produce ail we can, provided we can tind a market for our produata. The caue market at the prosent time is ovor crowded aud unlose more refineries are built it is not wise to incrones the acroago.
Our people realiziug the seriousnons of the condition, being confron'el with prospecte of immense caue crope with a-lack of grindiug fucilitios, bave hold a largoly attended mootiug laot Suuday morniug to diecues the situa. tion.
