Purifying Drinking Water.

Farm and Ranch.

A simple method of purifying any water for drinking purposes, by G. G. Nesmith, Ph. D., and R. R. Graham, M. B., publisher in the British Army Medical Journal:

A stock solution of chlorine may be readily made by rubbing up a teaspoonful of chloride of lime in a teacup with a little water to a thin mixture free from lumps. This should then be made up to a cupful and diluted with three more cupfuls of water to make the required stock solution. This will keep for a week when tightly corked.

A teaspoonful of this stock solution should be added to each two-gallon pail of drinking water required, thoroughly mixed and allowed to stand for a few minutes. This will give .4 to .5 parts of free chlorine to a million parts of water, and in 10 minutes will destroy all typhoid and colon bacilli, or other dysentery-producing organisms in the water. Moreover, all traces of chlorine will rapidly disappear.

This method of purification has been tested with water inoculated with millions of bacteria. Every dangerous germ has been destroyed.

WHAT EGGS ARE MADE OF.

The white of an egg is nearly seven-eighths water, the balance being nearly pure albumen. The yolk is slightly less than one-half water. These figures apply approximately to the egg of turkey, hen, geese, ducks, and guinea fowls.

To show how nearly alike the eggs of various domestic fowls are in respect to composition, the following figures are given by the department of agriculture:

Hen's eggs—50 per cent water, 16 per cent protein, 36 per cent fat.
Duck's eggs—46 per cent water, 17 percent protein, 36 per cent fat.
Goose eggs—44 per cent water, 19 per cent protein, 36 percent fat.
Turkey eggs—48 per cent water, 18 percent protein, 33 per cent fat.

Of course farmers understand that protein goes to make muscle and blood. Fat of course is fuel for running the machine. Thus it will be seen that eggs, though half or nearly water, are extremely nutritious containing all the elements required for the building and support of the human body. But the old saying that an egg contain as much nutriment as a pound of beefsteak is far from correct. It would be nearer the fact to estimate a pound of eggs as equal to a pound of lean beefsteak in nourishing power.—Cal. Cultivator.
