Corn and Yams As Basic Crops

St. Martin Marketing Bureau Brings Expert Here Sunday to Tell How to Grow Them.

None of the farmers who heard Harry Wilson explain the mysteries of truck growing at Bienvenu Theatre will miss the meeting after High Mass, Sunday, May 9, when J. A. Anders the government expert at Lafayette comes to tell how, in spite of the drought corn and sweet potatoes can still be made a fair crop.

Mr. Anders is none of your boiled shirt and hotel lobby farmers, but a practical active man who every day is in the field in jumper and overalls, working himself, and directing scores of other farmers in their practical and experimental work, today inoculating soil for clovers and tomorrow inoculating hogs and cattle for cholera and charbon; testing out fertilizers or selecting seeds.

He has had more than usual success in corn and potato growing himself, as have the Lafayette farmers working according to his instructions. Recently he induced the combined banks of that parish to buy and furnish a selected seed corn to the members of their Market Club, who are now carrying out a great experimental work that promises to increase the corn yield of that parish many times over.

The meeting is free to everybody and Bienvenu theatre should be filled to its doors this time as every man who attended the last talk should bring at least one of his neighbors.

Mr. Anders says he likes men who ask questions, so don't be afraid to speak up if there is anything you want to know.

The Lake Bridge Condemned.

The long bridge over the lake marsh was condemned by the Police Jury Monday and Tuesday the bridge was closed to the public, which is proving a great inconvenience to the public, and the business of St. Martinville will suffer in consequence.

The Police Jury will abandon this road altogether, and has appointed a committee composed of Messrs. C. E. Smede, D. C. Labbe, Henry Fournet and John B. de Laloire to trace and open the road through Mr. Henry Fournet's property, which is a road that had been suggested for a long time, as being a shorter road to Cade, but we do not know how it will inconvenience the people living on the lake and those living on the abandoned road on this side of the lake.

We hope, however, that the new road will be opened as soon as possible, as with the present condition of the road to Duchamp, that section is practically closed to us.
