New Waterway Project Launched at Washington, La.

PLAN PROVIDES DEEP WATER CONNECTION WITH MORGAN CITY AND NEW ORLEANS.

Washington, La., Sept. 9. — An important movement was launched yesterday at a mass meeting held here, attended by representative citizens of this section. The meeting was called to provide for an interchange of ideas and the formation of plans as to the best method of conserving and utilizing the waters of this watershed depending upon Bayou Courtableau, in a measure for an outlet, whether that outlet should remain as at present, not only useless but as a menace to a large area of fertile lands, or be confined into one channel and deflected into the Bayou Teche for a restoration and improvement of the navigation of those streams, bringing about direct communication between this section and deep water at Morgan City for export service; also a shorter and more practical and cheaper route to New Orleans through the Plaquemine locks into the Mississippi river.

In response to the call for the mass meeting, a large audience filled the opera house, composed of prominent citizens from St. Mary, Iberia, St. Martin's, Lafayette, St. Landry, Avoyelles and other sections. The conference was called to order by Mayor J. W. Mary, of Washington, who invited to the stage the attending mayors of the following cities: New Iberia, St. Martinville, Parks, Breaux Bridge, Loreauville, Port Barre, and several representatives citizens from the adjoining territory.

After a brief explanation of the objects of the meeting by Mayor Mary, he introduced Dr. Lazaro, Congressman from this district, Dr. Lazaro endorsed the movement, and pledged his support.

E. S. Broussard was next called on, and guaranteed the earnest support and co-operation of New Iberia and the lower sections of Bayou Teche.

Walter Brown, police juror of Port Barre, offered some instructive suggestions.

Senator R. F. Broussard, the next speaker, held his audience in close attention for about thirty minutes, explaining his efforts to secure this very project for the past nineteen years. Now, he said, he began to see the light of a full fruition of his ambition in the near future.

Senator J. E. Ransdell closed the discussion in a most entertaining, interesting and instructive speech of about thirty minutes.

Both distinguished speakers pledged their utmost endeavors an earnest support to the measure. About 400 persons were in attendance, and all were in perfect sympathy and harmony with the movement.

SELECTING POLICE JURORS

We have some of our people who are active advocates and who are making a lively campaign in favor of voting a tax for gravel road and who will take no interest in the selection of Police Jurors for the first ward. We will not favor any road tax under the present Police Jury because they are not interested in roads. We have suffered too much during the past three years on account of bad roads, and those lately repaired are already neglected and going to ruin. And we will not favor any road tax until we have members of the Police Jury for the first ward, we know to be road advocates and we know that they will build and maintain the roads after they are built. And we believe we express public opinion in these views.

A meeting of the Civic League was called last Friday night to discuss road matters with our business people after which several committees were appointed to bring this road question to some conclusion.

—Two car loads of cotton seed from Leonville passed here the latter part of last week for Gretna. One car was shipped by Mr. Ovide Robin and one by Mr. A. B. Dore. We learn that a good crop of cotton was raised in the upper part of the parish.

The Democratic Congress has passed the tariff law that removed the tariff on sugar because it was protecting a few at the expense of the masses, but instead of having this effect, it simply deprived a few of the benefit of the tariff to benefit only one big corporation—the sugar trust. What explanation can they give to the people now?

There is much discussion going on now as to how the State will meet its obligations, being short of funds and deep in debt. If the legislature in special session had amended the present constitution and cut down all the fancy salaries and abolished all the useless offices, the state would today have a nice balance to its credit instead of a deficit.
