Saving Linked Twin's Life When Sister Dies Is Baffling Problem.

Lafayette, La., Oct. 10.—All the science at the command of leading members of the medical profession here has been brought to bear on the unusual case of the linked twins born to Mrs. A. Foreman Thursday in an effort to save the life of one of the baby girls. One of the girls died Saturday morning and it is feared that while the physical condition of the other is comparatively favorable, that it will be impossible to save her life. The twins, which weighed about six pounds each when born, were linked together by a piece of bone extending across the side of each skull. An operation was considered but the idea was later abandoned as it was feared that the bone was hollow and that the brains of the two children were also joined. With the death of one of the twins, however it is probable that the operation will now be attempted in an effort to save the life of the remaining child. The other baby died twenty hours after the other.

TARIFF ON SUGAR ASSURED

The announcement by Secretary of the Treasurer McAdoo, with the approval of President Wilson, that the retention of the tariff on sugar will be recommended to Congress, makes the sugar interest feel that the tariff will remain as one of the best revenue producers, and those who seem to be in a position to know, feel that the tariff on sugar will remain for all times to come.

It is also recommended that a tariff be put on rice and lumber. The people of every congressional district should protest against imposition of war taxes in time of peace. A tariff on the home products that need protection is where we should get our revenues.


