## Polishes For Automobile and Furniture.

An excellent polish for furniture or automobile bodies can be made by thinning down boiled linseed oil with turpentine, writes the Ohio Extension Service. This applied sparingly to the clean surface with a cloth and rubbed briskly with a soft dry cloth, has been found very effective in restoring the gloss to surfaces that have become dull.

Another polish favored by some is made from one gallon of turpentine, 3 1/2 ounces citronella oil, 1 pint paraffine oil or light cylinder oil and 1 1/2 ounces oil of cedar. If the finish on a car has become very dull the appearance can be greatly improved by rubbing with a mixture of cylinder oil and kerosene.
