

CALL FOR BIDS.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Town of St. Martinville, Louisiana, at the office of the Mayor for constructing streets improvements in and for the Town of St. Martinville, Louisiana, until 5:30 P. M., September 15th, 1919, at which time opened and read publicly. The work includes the furnishing of all materials, labor, machinery, and equipment of every kind necessary to construct approximately 35,000 square yards of gravel pavement with necessary appurtenances all complete and in accordance with plans and specifications on file at the office of the Engineers and the Secretary of the Town Council.

Three alternate bids are desired as follows:
(a) Furnishing all materials and doing all work.
(b) Town to furnish materials and contractor to do the work
(c) Material people to furnish material to the Town.

Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check on a bank satisfactory to the Town Council for five per cent (5 per cent) of amount bid, drawn to the order of Albert Bienvenu, Mayor of St. Martinville, La.

A bond in the sum of fifty percent (50 percent) of the amount of contract with satisfactory surety will be required for the faithful performance of the work.

All bid will be compared on the basis of the Engineer's estimate of work to be done.
