### "TIN COW" FOR FRENCH BABIES.

Washington.—Over in the Aisne, Somme and Ardennes districts of France, there are thousands and thousands of babies who will grow up in the belief that milk grows in little tin cans, for in those districts the babies go out to lunch daily with their mothers, and are fed by the big "tin cow," which the Red Cross maintains there. It is virtually impossible to obtain fresh milk there, for this area withstood two invasions and two retreats by the Germans, and there are no cows because there is practically no grazing for them.

In this emergency the Red Cross not only promptly shipped in three carloads of condensed milk, but agreed to furnish an adequate supply of condensed milk for these districts during the next six months. With Laon and St. Quentin as the distributing centres, local French committees supply from twenty to thirty ruined villages, each with more than its share of undernourished infants. The mothers bring their babies to a milk station, where they are daily fed, weighed and given medical attention if required.

### POLITICIANS WILL HAVE POW-WOW AT STATE FAIR

Politicians will swarm to the Victory State Fair of Louisiana Thursday, October 23, because the management has designated that day as Political Day, with an invitation extended to every politician and all friends of politicians to be present.

One of the Wolves that are doing so much damage among the sheep, goats and cattle in the Cudde-Sac section, was trapped and killed Tuesday morning, by Mr. Vallot, manager of the Smede place. The Wolf is a large one.

—State Senator E. L. Simmons has formally announced that he is a candidate for re-election. State Senator J. R. Domengeaux of Lafayette has also announced his candidacy for re-election. Both have made good and should be re-elected.
