**"CARTER HARRISON A DEMOCRAT."**

In its Tuesday's issue our morning daily contained the comforting statement that Carter Harrison, like Judge Gresham and Gen. MacVough, had left the Republican ranks and would support Cleveland.

What an acquisition this is to the Democratic party. How great must have been the tumultuous swell of applause which went up from Democratic National headquarters, and how the adherents to this faith all over the Union must have joined in the joyful outcry when this report became a certainty. And what must have been the depressed state of the feeling at Republican headquarters when it was known that one of its strongest allies, had deserted them in a time of their greatest need. Though our political enemies, still we can not repress a feeling of pity for them in this hour of mental anguish, for the blow was indeed a sudden and terrible one.

But now romancing aside. Carter Harrison was a delegate to the Democratic National convention of 1884 and likewise of 1892. He has twice been elected mayor of Chicago on the Democratic ticket, and perhaps oftener. He is and has been one of the very stalwarts of Democracy in Illinois, and ever since we have been old enough to pay any attention to political affairs, we have known of his prominence in the po-

litical battles of his State as a Democrat.

Doubtless it would have been an amusing sight to have witnessed Carter Harrison reading the Shreveport Times account of his leave-taking of the Republican party, and the declaration of his intention to support Cleveland and Stevenson, all to the tune of slow music.


