ARTICLE VIII. The capital stock of this corporation is hereby authorized to be ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars, divided into and represented by one hundred shares of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars each, to be paid for in cash or its equivalent at the discretion of the board of directors. This corporation shall commence business whenever three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) of the capital stock shall be subscribed and paid in full.

ARTICLE IX. The corporate powers are hereby vested in the board of directors, to consist of seven stockholders, four of whom shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of the business of the corporation. The board of directors shall be elected annually on the first Monday of March of each year, beginning in
