A PROCLAMATION.

Special Election in School District No. 16 of Caddo Parish, Wednesday, June 18, 1913.

Pursuant to a resolution passed by the Parish Board of School Directors of the Parish of Caddo, Louisiana, at its regular meeting held on the 14th day of May 1913, I, T. H. Scovell, president of said board, hereby give notice that in compliance with said resolution, a special election will be held in school district No. 16 of the Parish of Caddo, Louisiana, on Wednesday, June 18, 1913, for the purpose of submitting to the property taxpayers qualified under the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana, to vote at said election, the following proposition, to-wit:

To levy a special tax of five mills on the dollar on all property in said school district subject to State taxation, annually for a period of ten years, or until the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars shall have been raised, said tax to begin with and including the fiscal year 1913, for the purpose of purchasing, if necessary, a site or sites in said district, erecting one or more school houses thereon, title to which shall vest in the public, and the location of which shall be determined by the School Board; and equip the same, and for maintenance.

2. For giving additional aid to the public schools of said district.

For the purpose of said election, the polling place will be Mt. Gilead, and H. B. Brown, E. E. Robertson and R. E. L. Huckabay the commissioners and S. B. Burney the clerk.

At said special election the polls will be open at 7 o'clock a.m., and close at 5 o'clock p.m., and the election will be conducted in accordance with the laws of Louisiana applicable thereto.

Notice is also given that at 1:30 p.m. on Friday, June 20, 1913, the said Parish Board of School Directors of Caddo Parish, Louisiana, will meet in its office in the court house, and in open session proceed to open the ballot boxes, examine and count the ballots in number and amount, examine and canvass the returns and declare the result of said special election.

AN ORDINANCE

Requiring automobile owners living outside of cities and towns to number their automobiles, and register their names and number with the clerk of the Police Jury of Caddo Parish.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of Caddo Parish, Louisiana, in legal session convened, that it shall be unlawful for any person to run or operate an automobile without having secured and placed upon the back of same in a conspicuous place, his number, so as to be plainly visible at all times during day light, in separate arabic numerals of not less than three inches in height, the strokes thereof to be of a width not less than one-half inch.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, that persons owning automobiles not living in towns or cities requiring numbers, shall place, in plain letters the word "Caddo Parish, La." under the number placed on said automobile.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, that any person owning, running or operating any automobiles in Caddo Parish, La., shall register with the clerk of the Police Jury his name and number of his said machine; provided that persons living in towns or cities that require numbers and registration of automobiles shall not be required to so register and number their said automobiles.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, that any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction be fined not more than ten dollars, or be imprisoned not more than ten days, or both at the discretion of the court.

AN ORDINANCE

Relative to the operation of automobiles, motor cycles and other vehicles on the public roads throughout the parish without the limits of any incorporated city or town in the parish; and to provide penalties for the violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of Caddo Parish, in regular session convened, that it shall be unlawful for any person or persons controlling or operating any automobile, motor cycle or other vehicle on the public roads of the Parish of Caddo, without the limits of any incorporated city or town, in the parish, to operate or drive or cause to be operated or driven at a greater rate of speed than twenty miles per hour.

Sec. 2. Be it further ordained, etc., that no person controlling or operating any automobile, motor cycle, or other vehicle shall drive such automobile, motor cycle or other vehicle at a greater rate of speed than ten miles per hour, while in the act of passing or attempting to pass in any direction on such public roads any other vehicles of whatever description.

Sec. 3. Be it further ordained, etc., (1) That any motor drawn vehicle or vehicles of any description whatever going in opposite directions shall pass each other on the right. (2) That any motor drawn vehicle or other vehicles overtaking another shall go to the left of the overtaken vehicle in passing.

Sec. 4. Be it further ordained, that no person operating or controlling any automobile or other motor vehicle on the public roads of the Parish of Caddo, shall drive around any curve in said public roads at a greater rate of speed than ten miles per hour, and shall on approaching such curve sound his horn twice as a danger signal.

Sec. 5. Be it further ordained, etc., that any motor vehicle or vehicle of any description coming to a full stop shall be to the right of the center of the road a sufficient distance to permit other vehicles to pass.

Sec. 6. Be it further ordained, etc., that whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined in a sum not less than ten (\$10.00) dollars nor more than twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars, or imprisoned in the parish jail not less than ten days nor more than thirty days, or both at the discretion of the court.

Sec. 7. Be it further ordained, etc., that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

CHARTER

Of the Crichton Mercantile Company

State of Louisiana, Parish of Caddo: Be it remembered that on this day before me, John D. Wilkinson a Notary Public in and for said parish and State, personally came and appeared O. A. Wright and F. E. Lacaize, residents of said parish and State, and D. H. Anglin a resident of the Parish of Red River, said State, who stated and declared to me, notary, that availing themselves of the laws of the State of Louisiana, relating to the formation of corporations, they have formed and constituted themselves, as well as such other persons as may hereafter become associated with them, into a corporation and have adopted and ordained as their charter, the following, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.

The name and title of this corporation shall be the Crichton Mercantile Company, and under said corporate name it shall have and enjoy succession of a period of fifty years, unless sooner dissolved as hereinafter set forth. Its domicile is hereby fixed at the city of Shreveport, Parish of Caddo, Louisiana, and all legal process shall be served on the President, at the domicile of the corporation.

ARTICLE II.

The purpose for which this corporation is formed and its objects are hereby declared to be to own, operate and conduct a general mercantile business at Crichton, in the Parish of Red River, Louisiana.

ARTICLE III.

This charter may be amended, or this corporation may be dissolved by a vote of the majority of the stock cast at a general stockholders meeting to be called for that purpose, except when otherwise provided by law and at all stockholders meetings each share of stock shall be entitled to one vote to be cast by its owner in person, or by written proxy. When not otherwise provided by law, notice of all stockholders meetings shall be given by ten days written notice to each stockholder at his usual postoffice

address, provided that by unanimous consent stockholders meetings may be held without any previous notice. When this corporation is dissolved by limitation, or otherwise its affairs shall be liquidated and settled by one or more liquidators elected by the stockholders at the meeting called for that purpose, and such liquidators shall give such bond and perform such duties as the stockholders may prescribe.

ARTICLE VI.

No stockholder of this corporation shall ever be held liable for the contracts or faults thereof in any further sum than the unpaid balance due on his stock, nor shall any mere informality have the effect of rendering this charter null, or of exposing any stockholder to any greater loss than the amount of his stock.
