Police Jury Proceedings.

STATE OF LOUISIANA,
PARISH OF LAFOURCHE.

Thibodaux La. Dec. 30th, 1899.

The Police Jury of this Parish met this day in extra session, pursuant to call of the President.

Present—Messrs. Leoncin President, E. U. Morvant, M. Bergeron, J. O. Toups, L. J. Troclair, J. L. Rodrigue, L. Faigout and J. L. LeBlanc.

Absent—Messrs. J. Godchaux and J. M. Bollinger.

There being a quorum present President Leoncin stated that he had deemed urgent to call the jury together in order that he might lay before it the fact that the Lockport Bridge Stock Co. would undoubtedly fail to have their bridge completed and subject to use by the general public on or before January 1st, 1900, inasmuch as the firming of the present Lockport Ferry had not been leased beyond said date, he deemed it proper for this jury to take suitable action in the premises, and Mr. Eugene Constantin, president of said Lockport Bridge Stock Co. being present was requested to explain why their said bridge was not completed.

Mr. Constantin stated that his company had contracted in ample time for the completion of said bridge and had made it a part of the contract that same was to be completed and ready for use by January 1st, 1900, but owing to the delay due to the manufacturers from whom the material of said bridge had been ordered it had become impossible for the contractors to fulfill their part of the contract.

Mr. Constantin stated that the bridge was so far advanced, that with the material on the spot, said bridge could be completed in 15 days, and he was asking the jury grant this said company 10 additional days to complete the bridge and that in meantime his said company would run the Lockport Ferry, for the accommodation of the public.

Whereupon, Mr. Morvant seconded by Mr. Toups, offered the following Resolution, which was adopted by the following vote:

Yeas—Aucouin, Morvant, Bergeron, Troclair, Toups, Rodrigue Faigout and LeBlanc.

Nays—None.

Resolution.

Whereas, on the 14th day of the month of October, acting under and by virtue of Resolution No. 117 adopted by this Jury at a meeting held on the 8th day of September 1898, Messrs. Emille U. Morvant, J. L. LeBlanc and Jules Godchaux, three members of this Jury, entered into a contract with Mr. Eugene Constantin, agent of the Lockport Bridge Stock Company, whereby said bridge was to be completed and ready for use on or before the first day of January, 1900; and whereas the said bridge was not completed and ready for use on the said date, to the effect that said proposed bridge shall be built and ready for use by the general public on or before the first day of January, 1900; and whereas the said bridge stock company has failed to comply with said condition owing to the failure of the contractor having charge of the construction of their said bridge to fulfill his obligation, and whereas considering the present status of said bridge structure, it may require about sixty days more to complete said bridge, therefore,

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Lafourche, in special meeting assembled, that further time be granted to the said bridge stock company to complete their said bridge, to-wit: until the 10th day of January, 1900, provided, however, that all other conditions and stipulations of the contract of October 8th, 1898 have been fully met and complied with, and provided further, that in view of the fact that this body did not contemplate or anticipate the present condition of the said bridge, did not sell the farming or lease of the Lockport Ferry along with the other Public Ferries of this parish on December 24, 1899, that the said bridge company binds and obligates itself or its successors to maintain and run a convenient and safe public Ferry at Lockport and to perform their full and faithful duty as public ferryman, conformably to Ordinance No. adopted by this Jury at its session held on November 18th, 1898, from and after January 1st, 1900 to the expiration of the additional time presently allowed it for the completion and operation of their said proposed bridge.

There being no other business, Mr. Morvant seconded by Mr. Rodrigue moved that the jury adjourn to meet January 10th 1900 instead of January 3d the day fixed. Carried.
