ORDINANCE NO. 223.

Laying a special tax for the year 1900 on all property situated in the parish of Lafourche subject to taxation under the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Section No. 1. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Lafourche, in regular meeting assembled, that an additional tax of ten mills on the value of all property situated in the parish of Lafourche, Louisiana, not exempt from taxation under the Constitution of 1892.

Section No. 2. Be it ordained, that the following items shall be appor- tioned and set apart, as follows:
First, six mills shall be set apart to pay the current expenses of the parish including the salaries of Parish officers, and shall be known as the General Fund.
Second, two and one half mills shall be set apart and used for the main- tenance of the public schools of the Parish, and shall be known as the public school fund.
Third, one half of a mill shall be set apart and used only for the purpose of repairing and repainting the public houses belonging to the parish.
Fourth, the salary of the Superin- tendent of schools of this parish shall be paid semi-annually, say on the 1st of July and January of each year.
Fifth, one mill shall be set apart for drainage purposes as at- tached by Ordinance No. 152 adopted on the 12th of 1898, and the Revised Ordinance of this parish Section 71, Adopted on the 12th of 1900, and the same shall be apportioned and expended as follows:
Section No. 3. Be it ordained ect, that this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage.

Section No. 4. Be it ordained, that the election of Road and drainage commissioners be deferred until the next year.

Section No. 5. Be it ordained, that the Police Jury and school Board of this parish be and are hereby dissolved, and the following named persons be and are hereby appointed to the office of Police Jury and school Board of this parish, to-wit:

C. J. Barker, H. Morvant, Hector Morvant, E. U. Morvant, L. Rodrigue, Alex. Theriot, J. L. LeBlanc and J. L. Barker.

Proposed Amendment.
Act. No. 73.
House Bill No. 73.—By Mr. B. T. Young: JOINT RESOLUTION.
Proposing an Amendment to Article 303 of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana.

Section One. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Louisiana, two-thirds of all members elected to each House concurring, That Article Article Three Hundred and Three of the Constitution of the State of Louisiana be so amended as to read as follows:

Article 303. A pension not to exceed Eight (\$8) Dollars per month shall be allowed to each Confederate soldier or sailor veteran, who possesses all of the following qualifications:
1st. He shall have served honorably from the date of his enlistment until the close of the late Civil War, or until he was discharged or paroled, in some military organization regularly mustered into the Army or Navy of the Con- federate States, and shall have remain- ed true to the Confederate States until the surrender.
2nd. He shall be in indigent circum- stances, and unable to earn a livelihood by his own labor or skill.
3rd. He shall not be salaried or other- wise provided for by the State of Louisiana, or by any other State or Govern- ment.

In case he enlisted in any organization mustered into said service as a Loui- siana organization, or in case at the date of his enlistment he resided in the State of Louisiana, he shall have resided in this State for at least five years prior to his application for pension. In case he resided elsewhere than in this State, and enlisted in an organization not mustered in from Louisiana, or in the Navy of the Confederate States, he shall have resided in this State for at least fifteen years prior to his applica- tion for such pension. A like pension shall be granted to the widow who shall not have married again, in indigent circumstances, of such soldier or sailor whose marriage to her was contracted prior to January 1st, 1870, provided, that if her deceased husband served in an organization mustered in from Loui- siana, or if he resided in Louisiana at the date of his enlistment, and has so resided for one year prior thereto, then in order that such widow shall be enti- tled to the pension as herein provided, she shall have resided in this State for at least five years prior to her applica- tion therefor; and if her deceased hus- band enlisted elsewhere than in Loui- siana, and served in an organization not mustered in from Louisiana such widow shall, in order to entitle her to pension as herein provided, have resided, in this State for not less than fifteen years prior to her application for such pen- sion; provided further, that pensions whether to veterans or to widows, shall be allowed only from the date of applica- tion under this article, and the total appropriations for all pensions shall not be less than fifty thousand dollars more than seventy-five thousand dollars in any one year, provided that nothing in this Article shall be consti- tuted so as to prohibit the General As- sembly from providing artificial limbs to disabled Confederate Soldiers and Sailors.

Section 2. Be it further enacted, That this proposed amendment be sub- mitted to the qualified voters of the State of Louisiana for adoption or rejec- tion, at the Congressional election to be held in November, 1900.
