**Mississippi Broom Factory.**  
Few know it, and few realize its future importance as one of the industries of Hazlehurst—but we have a broom factory, on a small scale, it is true, but it is now turning out the finished product, and will soon be prepared to take orders out of town. It is owned and operated by L. E. Ratliff. Last spring Mr. Ratliff conceived the idea and, as a start, planted five acres in broom corn. Before maturing, he bought the necessary machinery, and when the corn, which had been carefully cut and dried, was ready, he proceeded to manufacture it into brooms, the first installment having been turned out last week, and readily found a purchaser here at home. The samples shown us were good, the material being first class and the workmanship excellent.—Hazlehurst Courier.

BE IT REMEMBERED, That we, the undersigned Board of Supervisors of Election for the Parish of Lafourche, did this day repair to the Courthouse of said Parish for the purpose of compiling the returns sent in by the Commissioners of Election at the several polling places in said Parish, of an election held therein on the sixth day of November, 1900, for Electors for President and Vice-President of the United States, Representative from the 3rd Congressional District of Louisiana to the 57th Congress of the United States, and Proposed Amendment to Article 303 of the Constitution, agreeably to the laws of this State and in pursuance of the proclamations of his Excellency, William Wright Heard, Governor of Louisiana, of date, the eleventh day of September, 1900, and of the Board of Supervisors of Election of said Parish, and then there having arrived we proceeded in the presence of Robert J. Naquin, Oscar L. Caro and Francis L. **A DESTRUCTIVE FIRE SWEEPS HOUMA.**  
Many Business Houses Destroyed and Heavy Losses. Very Little Insurance.

A telephone message was received in our city about 2:30 o'clock on Thursday morning from sheriff Connelly of Houma, saying that the business portion of that town was being swept by fire and asking assistance from the Thibodaux fire department to subdue the flames. The fire companies made all possible haste to respond to the urgent call, but after reaching the depot with their engine to board the train news came that the fire was under control and therefore they did not go. However, sheriff James Beary, Robt. Naquin, A. J. Braud, James Wilson, Jos. Naquin, Ed. Riviere and Paul Aucoin, secured carriages and drove over to our neighboring unfortunate town to render any needed assistance and to ascertain the extent of the conflagration. One of Houma's citizens, who witnessed the fire and helped to fight it sent the Sentinel the following information of the disaster: The fire started in rear of John Cronzielle's restaurant, opposite the Court House, between 1 and 1:30 o'clock a. m. on Thursday, and the following buildings were burned: Cronzielle's Restaurant, DeLanion's Restaurant, Z-ringer's Saloon, on Goode street; A. Adam's Barber shop, J. Larose's Fruit stand, corner Main and Goode street; Old Saucer Hotel, Mrs. J. Toups Fruit stand, and W. H. Bland, Jeweler, Main street, vacant building, corner Main and Roussel street; two small buildings next to Bergers stable, Berger-Bros' two story stable, Bethancourt and Lirette's saloon, Houma Courier on bayou side of Main street; Standard Drugstore two story (C. M. Daspit) Miss E. Bialah's millinery (same building); A. B. Bundy goods and clothing, Masonic Lodge, up stairs in same building; Winchester & Galtie, Law offices

and Prices store—two story building bayou side of Main street; Crochet's black-smith shop torn down to stop fire; Davidson's & Avery General merchandise store badly damaged by heat and fire; Electric wires and telephone badly damaged, estimated at about \$800. The only insurance mentioned by our correspondent was that of C. M. Daspit, but it is to be hoped that later news will show that other losses were more or less covered by insurance also.

The night was calm and foggy, but if there had been a strong wind blowing it is said the whole town would have been laid in ashes. Our friends over in Houma should
