To Whom It May Concern.

We understand that considerable uneasiness exists among the planters living along the line of the New Orleans and Southwestern R. R., who fear that the construction of the road will interfere with their labor.

In the event that such laborers are found working on this line, the Chief Engineer will order his dismissal from the work, whether he be employed by ourselves or by any of the sub-contractors.

In fact, it is stipulated in our contract with the New Orleans and Southwestern R. R. Co., that we will not interfere in any manner with the labor employed by the planters living along the line of our construction. And we wish this clearly understood.

Proceedings of the Police Jury.

shall be free for all parish purposes; that tolls charged for the use thereof by all other persons shall not exceed those now charged by other Canal Companies in this State; and provided further that the franchise now sought shall be null and void unless the said Canal be completed within five years from the date of the grant of the franchise therefor.

Your petitioners pray for the granting of this franchise at your meeting to be held during the present month, in as much as it is urgent that it be known to your petitioners whether or not they will be permitted to commence the construction of said canal at once.

In the event that the said canal be constructed so as to intersect the bayou Lafourche at a point on either side of the bayou Lafourche, previous to the opening or locking of the bayou Lafourche at Donaldsonville, where there are State or parish levees existing, the said canal shall be properly and safely locked.

Further your petitioners will continue to pray.

ORDINANCE NO.

Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Lafourche in regular meeting assembled, that a franchise for the construction of a toll Canal intersecting the bayou Lafourche at some point between the 33rd and 53rd, mile post on bayou Lafourche below the town of Thibodaux, be and is hereby granted to Messrs. Bragard and Constantin Bros., their heirs and assigns upon the following conditions, to-wit:

(1) The said Canal shall be not less than 30 feet in width and shall at all times be open to the public offering to pay for the privilege and use thereof a toll not exceeding those now charged by other canal owners or companies now existing in this State.

(2) The use of the said canal shall at all times be free for use by the Parish authorities of this Parish and it shall be so constructed as to not interfere with but rather enhance and improve the facilities of the section through which it passes.

(3) If said Canal intersects the bayou Lafourche at a point where there are or shall be levees exist on either bank of the bayou Lafourche, then, said canal shall be locked in a manner satisfactory to the authorities in interest, but locks shall be required, however, if previous to the construction of the contemplated canal the bayou Lafourche shall have been locked or dammed at Donaldsonville or elsewhere.

(4) The canal shall be completed from the bayou Blue on the west side of bayou Lafourche, to the Lake Salva dore or other deep lakes or bayous on the east side of the said bayou Lafourche, within five years from this date, under penalty of the forfeiture of this franchise.

(5) The term for the duration of the present franchise is hereby fixed and named to be 99 years.

(6) The owners of said canal when dug an operation, shall be held to pay into the Parish treasury to the credit of the Public Schools of this parish the sum of \$100.00 annually.

Section 2. Be it further ordained, etc. that this ordinance shall go into effect from and after its promulgation.

The above petition and ordinance were read and discussed, and after amendments and erasures the ordinance as it appears above was adopted.

Yeas—Ancoin, Basset, Guedry, Barrios, Morvant, Rodrigue, Falgout, LeBlanc and Parra.
Nays—none.

Mr. Parra duly seconded nominated Mr. Valfrid Toups to fill the duties of the Lockport District caused by the acceptance of the resignation of Mr. L. A. Bellanger on yesterday, and there being no other nominations, Mr. Toups was declared elected.

Mr. Morvant seconded by Mr. Parra submitted the following ordinance, which was duly adopted.

Yeas—Ancoin, Basset, Guedry, Barrios, Morvant, Rodrigue, LeBlanc and Parra.
Nays—Basset and Falgout.

RESOLUTION.

Be it resolved by the Police Jury of the Parish of Lafourche in regular meeting assembled, that the Parish Jail be repaired and modernized and made to be fire proof as much as is possible, without however, interfering with the outside walls of the building except for the purpose of enlarging the present windows and doors and of strengthening the whole building.

Resolved further, that with the view of proceeding at once with the said repairs and modernizing of the Parish Jail, the President of this Jury hereby empowered and directed to appoint a committee of 2 with himself as ex-officio chairman, who are hereby authorized and empowered to proceed within the shortest delay in adopting a plan and specification which shall contain and set forth in detail all the contemplated changes, by them determined upon in carrying out the present resolutions, and to contract for the carrying out of such plan and specifications with whomsoever they may deem fit, provided however, that the amount called for by the contract shall not exceed the sum of 6,000 dollars.

Resolved further, that all contracts made by said committee shall be made on the basis of cash and for the purpose of meeting the payments called for by their said contracts, the sum of 6,000 dollars or as much thereof as may be required, is hereby set aside and appropriated from the General Fund now in the Treasury, subject to be drawn against at any time by the President of this Jury on a warrant approved by a majority of the special committee created under these resolutions.

President Ancoin appointed on the committee called for by the foregoing ordinance, Messrs. Morvant and Guedry.

On motion of Mr. Parra, seconded by Mr. LeBlanc, the following resolution was adopted.

Yeas—Ancoin, Basset, Guedry, Barrios, Morvant, Rodrigue, Falgout, LeBlanc and Parra.
Nays—none.

Resolved that the Pres. and Messrs. Morvant and Guedry are hereby authorized and empowered to have all such repairs to the Court House and Sheriff's house as they after an investigation and report thereon.

Resolved further, that an appropriation of \$200 or as much thereof as may be necessary is hereby made to pay for such repairs when made.

The matter reported by Mr. Laforest relative to Railroad on the public road on the Baton Pilon ridge was referred to Mr. Rodrigue, the member from the sixth Police Jury and to the road Inspector of District No. 2 for investigation, if said report is found to be true, then the President is directed to notify the parties to whom said road belongs to remove same at once from said public road.

Mr. L. Toups, Road Inspector of District No. 1, reported the Howard Bridge on Lower bayou Blue to be rotten and dangerous, and that the probable cost of renewing same to be \$20.00. Order was given to him to contract for the erection of a new bridge.

The Jury then adjourned to the first Monday of July next.
