IT IS KNOWN, that on this 23rd day of the month of May, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Two, before me, Notary Public in and for the Parish of Lafourche, State of Louisiana, commissioned and qualified, and in the presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned:

BARKER, Clerk of the 20th Judicial District Court of Louisiana, in and for the Parish of Lafourche, do hereby certify that the above and foregoing articles of incorporation of The Des Allemands Lumber Company, Limited, is a true and correct copy of the original on file on the records in my office, and recorded in Miscellaneous Book No. 7, folios...

ORDINANCE NO. Be it ordained by the Police Jury of the Parish of Lafourche in regular meeting assembled, that a franchise for the construction of a canal intersecting the bayou Lafourche at some point between the 33rd and 35rd, mile post on bayou Lafourche below the town of Thibodaux, be and is hereby granted to Messrs. Bragard and Constantin Bros., their heirs and assigns upon the following conditions, to-wit:

ARTICLE I. The name of this corporation shall be The Des Allemands Lumber Company, Limited, and it shall have its principal office in the town of Thibodaux, Louisiana, and its corporate name, to make and use a corporate seal, and make, break and alter the same at pleasure, to hold, purchase, sell, mortgage or hypothecate property, real personal or mixed, to issue and issue bonds, to lend any portion of its capital stock or income, or to invest the same in any other security, to elect or appoint managers, directors and agents, and to make and establish such by-laws, rules and regulations as may be necessary for its proper management.

ARTICLE II. The domicile of this corporation, and its principal office for the transaction of business, shall be in the town of Bowie, Parish of Lafourche, Louisiana, and the President, in his absence, the Vice-President, shall be the officer upon whom citation, or other judicial process shall be served.

ARTICLE III. The capital stock of this corporation shall be fixed at the sum of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (100,000), and go into effect, and said corporation become a legal entity, on the 1st day of January, 1903, and shall be divided into One Thousand (1,000) shares of the par value of One Hundred Dollars per share, and shall be paid in cash, or the equivalent in bonds, mill property, timbered land, or any other property which the Board of Directors may approve.

ARTICLE IV. The objects and purposes of this corporation, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are hereby declared to be, to do a general lumber, manufacturing and general mercantile business; to own and operate saw mills, planing mills, shingle mills, and other mills; also railroad, pull-boats and steamboats; to make contracts for the sale of lumber, shingles, etc., and to purchase and sell timber on the land of other states, and in fact to do any and all things necessary and proper to the carrying out of its business.

ARTICLE V. The business of this corporation shall be conducted by and vested in a Board of Directors composed of Five (5) Stockholders owning one or more shares of stock. Said directors shall be elected at a general meeting of the stockholders for that purpose on the second Tuesday in January in each year, and each share of stock present or represented shall be entitled to one vote. The election shall be held at the principal office of the corporation, after ten days notice to each stockholder. Failure to hold an election on the day specified shall be deemed to have been waived, and the directors in office shall hold their respective offices until the election shall be subsequently held, and ten days notice of time and place given.

ARTICLE VI. No vacancies in said board from whatever cause shall be filled by the Board of Directors. The Secretary and Treasurer need not be a stockholder in this corporation. The majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The Vice-President may be the General Manager of the corporation, and the salaries of all the officers of the corporation shall be fixed by a majority vote of the Stockholders at the date of the election.

ARTICLE VII. This Act of incorporation may be amended, altered or modified, or this corporation dissolved by a vote of three-fourths of the shares of the total amount of stock at a meeting held for the purpose after ten days notice in writing mailed to the address of each stockholder, and at least one advertisement in the official newspaper of the Parish of Lafourche.

ARTICLE VIII. At the expiration of this Charter, or if sooner dissolved, the affairs of this corporation shall be liquidated by the Board of Directors, who are hereby vested with full power to sell any and all assets of the corporation, and to pay full and complete satisfaction thereon, and they shall have full power to do and perform all acts necessary and proper to fully and completely liquidate the affairs, and distribute the proceeds, if any, among the stockholders in proportion to the amount of stock held by each.

ARTICLE IX. The following named persons shall constitute the first Board of Directors: R. H. DOWNMAN, President; E. G. WESTMORELAND, Vice-President and Manager, and F. H. LEWIS, Secretary and Treasurer. J. F. WINGINGTON, and C. J. BRAUD, shall hold their offices until the second Tuesday in the month of January, 1903, or until their successors are elected and qualified.

ARTICLE X. This corporation shall be authorized to begin business whenever the sum of ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS of stock shall have been subscribed. The stock of this corporation is transferable only upon the books of the same.

To Whom It May Concern.

We understand that considerable uneasiness exists among the planters living along the line of the New Orleans and Southwestern R. R. who fear that the construction of the road will interfere with their labor. We wish to be well understood in this connection and so beg to state for the benefit of the plantation owners and for the laborers as well, that our Chief Engineer, Capt. H. P. Farrar has already been instructed to issue a general letter to all sub-contractors to the effect that no laborer shall be employed in this construction who are plantation laborers, unless they can show a written release from their employer.

In the event that such laborers are found working on this line, the Chief Engineer will order his contract from the work, whether he be employed by ourselves or by any of the sub-contractors. In fact, it is stipulated in our contract with the New Orleans and Southwestern R. R. Co., that we will not interfere in any manner with the labor employed by the planters living along the line of our construction. And we wish this clearly understood.

In conclusion, we would suggest to the planters that we feel safe in saying that instead of diverting laborers from their fields, we will contribute additional labor to the country, as very nearly all the labor employed will be from a distance.
