UNITED STATES OF AMERICA. THE STATE OF LOUISIANA. PARISH OF LAFOURCHE.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That on this thirtieth day of the month of November in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-Six, and of the American Union the hundred and second year, Before me, John O'Brien Knobloch, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified in and for said Parish and therein residing, and in the presence of Messrs Octave Barrois and Adolphe H. Hoffmann, good and competent witnesses, also domiciliated in said Parish,

Personally came and appeared: Messrs. Henry Nicholas, Coulon, Mathew T. Higginbotham, Cyprien Azema, P. Ernest Loric, Dr. John H. Fleetwood, James A. Frost, Joseph O. Lagarde, Maximilian Couintout, Joseph L. Wehre, Taylor E. Lagarde, Ellis N. Braud, James Otis Knobloch, J. G. Oswald, S. T. DeManade.

Who declared and said: That availing themselves of the laws of the State, relative to the organization of Corporations, they form and constitute themselves as well as their associates now or who may hereafter joined them, an Association, the objects of which are hereinafter set forth and explained.

Article I - The name shall be the Young Men's Benevolent Association of Lafourche.

Article II - The objects shall be to assist our needy members, nurse the sick, bury our dead, and take care and provide for such widows and orphans of our deceased members.

Article III - The Officers shall consist of a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Junior and a Collector.

Article IV - The Domicile of the Association is fixed at Thibodaux, Parish and State aforesaid.

Article V - This Association is hereby established for the period of Twenty-Five years.

Article VI - This Association will be able to sue and to be sued before all the Courts of the State or elsewhere, to receive contributions of money and of property real and personal, to buy, rent and keep all such buildings or lots, which may be requisite for the benefit of the Association, also to give, sell, transfer and dispose of the same. It shall also have a seal which can be destroyed or renewed when it will be necessary.

Article VII - The President shall be the proper party on whom all notices shall be served.

Article VIII - This Association has also the right to pass such a Constitution, By Laws, rules and regulations as may be required for its good government, provided such be not in controversy with this Charter or the laws under which it is organized. This done and passed, at my office in the town of Thibodaux, on the day, month and year first above written.
