**REPUBLICANS OF OHIO**

The Fight Is Not Between Hanna and Foraker Alone.

**OTHERS INTERESTED.**

The Daugherty, Cox and McKinnon Factions Are Concerned in the Election of Officers of the House and the Senate.

Columbus, O., Jan. 4.—Members of the Ohio legislature, as well as the candidates for legislative positions, are all here participating in the contest previous to the caucuses for this evening when the nominations are to be made for the organization of the legislature Monday. While both Ohio senators have become indirectly involved in the contest, it develops on the homestretch that lines will not be strictly drawn between their friends. Many members concur with George B. Cox in stating that this fight is not one for supremacy of either Foraker or Hanna in Ohio, and that they are on equally cordial relations with both senators. The lines are much more distinctly drawn between what are known as the Cox and Daugherty men.

Two years ago ex-representative Harry M. Daugherty was defeated for the gubernatorial nomination by Governor Nash. Daugherty ran on "anti-boss issue" and his canvass offended the friends of both the Ohio senators, and especially George B. Cox of Cincinnati. McKinnon was a Daugherty man then and leader in the last legislature which was controlled in its organization by Daugherty men. Cox is now supporting Price for speaker, as he says, because he was pledged to him before the present complications arose. And he also says he would never have joined Senator Hanna in supporting McKinnon for speaker. While Cox is friendly with both senators, Daugherty is the avowed opponent of both, though Hanna and Daugherty are for the same man for speaker. The entanglement goes still further and the crossing of the wires extends to ex-governor Foster, ex-governor Bushnell, ex-State Chairman Kutz and others who are now cooperating with those from whom they are said to be estranged. Cox says he found Senator Foraker at first friendly to McKinnon and Senator Hanna favorable to Price, and the time that he committed himself both of the Ohio senators approved of Price for speaker. Cox insists that the present entanglements are temporary.

**HOME RULE FIGHT.**

Redmond Says Irish Will Renew Efforts Despite the Cost.

London, Jan. 4.—John Redmond's speech at Sligo is an indication of the attitude of the Nationalist party at the next session of parliament. The Irish leader devoted some of the choicest flowers of his rhetoric to discover the Liberals who, like Lord Rosebery, are a little tired of Irish allowance. The Nationalists have received an intimation that the alliance is to be thrown over with scarcely any velled contempt, and Redmond advised Lord Rosebery to rally around him all "those rotten members of the Liberal party, who called themselves Liberal Imperialists." Apparently the meaning of all this is that the Irish party will again fight for home rule without the slightest regard for the feelings of their former English allies.

**Forced into Liquidation**

St. Paul, Jan. 4.—The St. Paul Trust company, capital \$200,000, has voted to go into liquidation. The chief cause of the recent supreme court decision making the trust company liable on a judgment for \$100,000 in the estate of C. D. Strong, which has been in charge of the company for the last eight or ten years. Creditors will probably be paid in full, but stockholders will receive uncertain amounts. The announcement is made by the public examiner. The company's business has been very extensive.

**Will Christen Kaiser's Yacht.**

Washington, Jan. 4.—Miss Alice Roosevelt, eldest daughter of President Roosevelt, will christen the German kaiser's new yacht, now building at Staten Island, N. Y. The invitation to Miss Roosevelt was extended through Dr. Von Helldorf, the German ambassador to the United States.

**Returns Home Wealthy.**

Lockport, N. Y., Jan. 4.—John H. Roes, who up to 1897 was a salesman for a New York wooden house, has returned home after being mourned for dead. He is back from the Klondike, a rich man.

**No Assault on Milner.**

London, Jan. 4.—The rumor current in this city that an attempt had been made to assassinate Lord Milner, British high commissioner in South Africa, is wholly unconfirmed and is entirely discredited in responsible quarters.

**Sampson No Better.**

Washington, Jan. 4.—The condition of Rear Admiral Sampson shows some improvement. His family desires to add nothing to the statement already published concerning the symptoms of his malady.

**Crushed by Log Train.**

Lake Charles, La., Jan. 4.—Wm. Innes, an employe of the Industrial Lumber company at Oakdale, fell from the log train and under the wheels and was instantly killed.
