

Instantly Killed.

He was alone and no one was nearer than the camp house, so that the true cause of the explosion will never be known.

Killed by Police.

New Orleans, Jan. 31.—John Edwards was shot and killed yesterday by two policemen on whom he fired. Edward stood off a score of bluecoats a year ago and had become imbued with the idea that the whole force was afraid of him. He gave it out that he would not be arrested and when an attempt was made to do so he opened fire, sending a bullet into the breast of Officer Kilroy which broke a button on the policeman's coat but did not injure him. Kilroy and his partner returned the fire and Edwards died instantly.
