Gulf Mission.

The third day of the Gulf Mission conference of the Methodist Episcopal church being held at the Simpson Methodist church corner of Pajo and Common streets was opened with devotional services, led by Rev. W. C. Mann, at 9 o'clock a. m. this morning.

At 9:30 the sacrament of Holy communion was administered to all elders and brothers present.

Bishop Cyrus W. Foss then delivered a short but eloquent address on what he expressed as being "the tallest monument on earth; the Holy communion, the sacred sacrament of the last supper, this Holy devotion that is as much to the native of England, Ireland, Germany or some of the people of China, as it is to us."

After the Bishop's address a business session was entered into, at which, after the minutes of yesterday were read and adopted the nineteenth question in the rule book was taken up. This question affected the conduct of Rev. W. G. Campbell formerly of this place. Rev. Campbell's name was, after a unanimous vote by the presiding elders, ordered withdrawn under complaint from the ministry.

A report was then read from Rev. M. C. Hickman, presiding elder of the district. He reported his field of work, which extends from Crowley on the east to Port Arthur on the west, to be in a flourishing condition, with the exception of Lake Arthur, for which place, however, he has the brightest hopes. Shortly after this report an adjournment was had.—Press.
