ARRANGING FOR TERMS OF PEACE

The English and Boer Leaders to Meet in a Peace Conference.

London, March 25.—The Chronicle declares today that an armistice is being arranged by British and Boer forces in South Africa. It is believed here to be beginning of the end of the war. A Belgian organ is urging the Boer to relinquish hopes and independence and re-establish peace. Consols rallied sharply as a result of the news.

GENERAL MILES

MAKES STATEMENT.

Objects to the Present Plan of the Army Reorganization Bill.

Washington, March 25.—The statement of General Miles before the senate military affairs committee, as it will appear in the official records was made public last night. Concerning the statement heretofore published showing how the president could by promotions make a captain chief of staff with the grade of lieutenant general, General Miles said: "It seems to me you are throwing the door wide open for a future autocrat or military despot. It is not in accordance with the principal and theory of democratic government, nor for the best interests of the army, which has existed more than one hundred years and fulfilled all your requirements."
