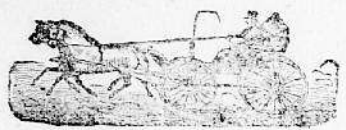

Can Teach us to Cook Rice.

S. Uchida, consul general of Japan of New York City, is spending today in Lake Charles and is being shown around by Prof. S. A. Knapp. This morning they visited the lumber mills and are looking at the rice plantations this afternoon.

In conversation with an American reporter, Mr. Uchida said that he had been in the United States six years in his present capacity. "This is my first trip south," he continued, "and my mission is to make a careful study of the cotton mills and see how rice is raised. I am especially interested in the importation of Japanese seed rice into this section, but will also pay close attention to the cultivation of other kind of seeds planted, in fact everything that pertains to rice."

"Rice is our staple food in Japan. We eat rice at every meal, breakfast dinner, luncheon and supper, just as you Americans eat bread and butter. I came here last night from Houston. I will go to Beaumont this evening, from which place I will go back to Houston. I am interested in cotton culture in Texas. We have a good many cotton mills in Japan; however, we do not raise much cotton. Most of it is imported from the United States, particularly from the state of Texas. Our forty million population is crowded into an area of 150,000 square miles. Most of the land is given up to the raising of rice and a very small portion to cotton."

"In Japan, manufactures are growing very fast and cotton mills are in the lead. Our importation of cotton from America is on the increase. We also import some from India and China, but the Yankee cotton is far better in quality than either the Chinese or Indian. Before returning to New York City I will visit North and South Carolina and Georgia and there study the methods of making cotton-pile goods."

In speaking about the way which rice is cooked in America, Mr. Uchida said: "The people of Japan have a great many things to learn from this country about my estimation, the things that we can teach you is how to cook rice properly."

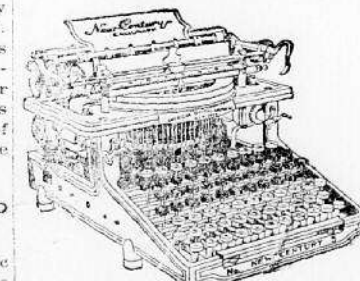

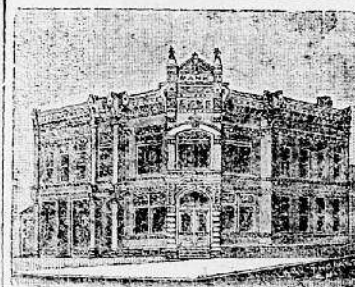
