
Farmers' Institutes.



Cameron's Oil Prospects

One of the most elaborate pieces of oil literature ever printed is the prospectus of the Higgins Standard Oil Co., copies of which have just been received in the city. Local interest is felt in this company from the fact that its secretary and treasurer J. Stuart Thompson, and a director, Gen. T. T. Taylor, reside in this city, and J. B. Watkins, also a director, is largely interested.

The prospectus gives the original oil man's theories of the formation of oil, oil pools, etc., and his history of the Beaumont oil fields, which is spicy and well not reproduced in Beaumont. The holdings of the company are said to be 155,000 acres of land (owned), embracing all the west portion of Cameron parish, 42,000 acres leased in Sabine and San Augustin counties, just west of Sabine parish, and 500 acres on Barber's hill, Chambers county, Texas, 26 miles from Houston besides some on Spindle Top.

Of the Cameron land Mr. Higgins says the entire body is first class oil land and will yield a higher grade oil than Beaumont. He expects to build a refinery and part of his own on the east side of Sabine Lake, fifteen miles from the pass. The company is now drilling on Barber's hill, near Houston. The capital stock is five millions and the shares \$100 each.—American.
