BRAZIL'S NEW PRESIDENT

Was Inaugurated Today and Appointed His Cabinet.

 Rio de Janeiro, Nov. 15.—Dr. Francisco de Pauly Rodrigues Alves was today inaugurated as president of Brazil, the installation being marked with the customary ceremony and the day being observed as a general holiday throughout the republic. The new president has chosen a cabinet that enjoys the confidence of all the business and banking interests and it is generally felt that Brazil is about to enter upon a new era of prosperity. The ministers, notably Baron de Rio Branco, the Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Senhor Leopoldo Bulhoes, the Minister of Finance have travelled extensively in the



United States and Europe and are generally recognized as liberal and progressive statesmen.

Dr. Rodrigues Alves, the new president, for many years has been a conspicuous figure in the politics of Brazil. He is a native of the state of Sao Paulo and has lately been governor of that progressive and rich state. As a financier, it is said by his friends that Dr. Rodrigues Alves has no superior in South America. His ability was recognized by President Peixoto, who appointed him Minister of Finance in his cabinet. President Moraes retained him in that place.

Dr. Rodrigues Alves is a lawyer and has occupied a leading place at the bar. He was the candidate of the republican party and his election is considered a great triumph because of the high standing and prominence of his defeated opponent, Dr. Ubaldo do Amaral.

Swarthmore's New President.

The installation ceremonies were held this morning in the main hall of the college. The participants included the students, faculty and alumni, together with eminent representatives of many of the leading institutions of learning throughout the country.

Of Interest to Young Men.
 To the young man clerking in a store, driving a delivery wagon or "pulling a bell cord over old Pete" for a bare living; to the young lady fast wearing out her nervous system teaching school for \$200 a year; to the girl who sews, cooks, washes and irons, this paper ventures a few suggestions that may be the means of getting you out of the crowd of over-worked and under-paid toilers.

You are worth to the business world simply what your education has prepared you to earn. The boy whose education has fitted him for nothing better may expect to continue to use a spade and be bossed and sworn at. The same is true of the girls at the wash tub.

Hewers of the wood and drawers of water for other people must work with out thanks, labor without applause, grow old before their time, and go down to their graves unhonored, unwept and unsung.
