

Successful Treatment.

Mr. Conrad Krueger, of Ellis county, Kas., an experienced stockman, both in Europe and America, writes the Kansas City Live Stock Indicator, under date of March 13, telling how he has successfully baffled the dreaded and much talked of cattle disease, as follows:

Seeing in your columns much about the foot and mouth disease among cattle, I will give you my experience about this disease and the treatment for it, which may prove a help to some of my fellow cattlemen. I have seen and treated the disease twice in Germany, and was, the last time, very successful in saving every animal of the herd I had control of.

The animals were valuable dairy cows, and at the time the disease made its appearance all of them were kept in a barn where they stood in double rows of twenty head, eating out of a manger constructed of brick and well cemented. These mangers serve for both feeding and watering, and were kept scrupulously clean.
