Tobacco.

The news from every part of the country where tobacco is produced is to the effect that an increased acreage will be planted this year. For good and sufficient reasons, as we think, this idea of increased acreage is to be regretted on account of its carrying with it what we already have too much of, viz., a low grade of tobacco. What we want is not an increase acreage, but a better article of tobacco than has been raised in this country for several years. Unless the quality is greatly improved, whether much or little is raised there is no likelihood of remunerative prices being received. If the farmer, after the ordinary fashion, can raise ten acres of tobacco this year and realize prices below the cost of production as is likely to be the case, he will not better have half the acreage and double the price? The low prices now realized is said by all tobacco men to be the result of flooding the market with a very inferior article of tobacco, and that the inferiority is occasioned by too large an acreage, the want of sufficient barn room in curing, and the lack of care in handling. For this year, as formerly, farmers are advised to lessen the acres of tobacco they raise, as a means of improving the quality. This advice comes from the proprietors of tobacco houses that are posted in regard to the market, both present and prospective. Below we give the quotations of price list of Evans Bro's, Tobacco and Ware-house company, St. Louis. So that those interested may see what chances the buyers of last year's crop have to make money on their purchases.

"The market conditions have not changed since our last report, the usual low price being bid on the breaks, and there was no improvement in the quality or condition of the tobacco offered. Reports of plant beds are to the effect, that plants are abundant, and in excellent condition.

We charge \$1.25 for making one blanket, you furnish wool if you want. For a heavy blanket it will take 6 lbs of clean wool to make it.

We will work your wool into jeans, blanket or blankets for you—half. This means clean wool.
