DALLAS, Tex., April 3, 1887.

DEAR SIR:—The Prohibitionists are active, and the central committee have thought best to issue to our friends the following admonition and advice...

1st. The saloon men in each county should see that at least one or two active, influential men from their county (not engaged in the whisky business) attend the Dallas convention to be held May 4, 1887.

2d. They should at once, in their respective counties, secure friends in each voting precinct who will distribute literature and be on hand on election day at their precinct voting place.

3d. The local dealers should secure the service of their prohibition papers so that the anti-prohibition side may be read by the people.

4th. They should also secure the services of at least one good and influential man in each county who will fully present all the objections to prohibition, especially its impracticability and effect on the state revenues, and who will speak in each precinct.

5th. The saloon men should be very active and vigilant and they should as much as possible work through those who have no personal interest in the business, and who are fighting prohibition on principle.

6th. On election day you should see that there are honest judges of election in every precinct who will watch the ballot, and you should also see that anti-prohibition tickets are printed according to law in every precinct.

7th. At present our friends should be active in seeing that the people are influenced by speakers, literature and the press.

8th. You should thoroughly organize in each county, and work through a chairman with power to act.

9th. It will require a strong fight to win, as the Prohibitionists are trying to make it a religious war.

The sooner you perfect your county organization the better. Whoever is selected to organize and stump the county should come to the Dallas political convention May 4th.

At once and from time to time send us the names of men at the different post offices in your county who can be reached by argument. Also the names of drug stores and barber shops where people resort so that we can send them speeches, statistics, etc.

On election day every one should close up and go to the poles and work. Ask the people not to starve your families to enrich druggists and doctors.

Do all you can to help on the political movement, and from time to time report the condition of things.

"Vigilance is the price of liberty," and no campaign can be successfully carried on without liberality and energy.
