IN Kentucky they have a law which compels railroads to provide a separate coach for the accommodation of colored people. The Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad company felt itself aggrieved by this law and appealed to the U. S. supreme court to set it aside from a decision of the Kentucky court of appeals, which sustained the law. Last Monday the U. S. supreme court affirmed the decision of the Kentucky court, Justice Harlan dissenting, taking the ground that the law interferes with the inter-state law, and that the legislature has no right to classify citizens by color in railway coaches.
