Many From the Farm.

Two hundred and thirty of the first 1,000 students enrolled in the university of Missouri this year are from farm homes. The next largest representation, 77 in number, is from the homes of merchants. Lawyers send 43; doctors, 33; teachers, 23; insurance and real estate dealers, 23; county officers, 16; drummers, engineers and bankers, 15, each; preachers, 14; contractors, 11; druggists, 10; editors, six; mechanics, five; postmasters, bookkeepers, and mine operators, four, each; postal clerks, blacksmiths, freight agents, hotel proprietors, dentists, saloon-keepers, laborers, cabinet-makers, stenographers and jewelers, two, each. Other vocations such as brick-makers, vehicle dealers, glass workers, photographers, surveyors, grain inspectors, live stock brokers, tanners, teamsters, plumbers, sewing machine agents, librarians, abstractors, express agents, auditors, road foreman and gravel roofers have but one representative, each. Here are 740 replies. The remaining 260 of the 1,000 give no reply to the question concerning the occupation of their parents or guardian.


