

In addition to the proceedings published in the COURIER of last week, action was had in other matters at the November, 1906, term of county court as follows:

Ordered that the sum of \$40 a year be and is appropriated, payable to the order of Wm. Rodgers, for the support of Francis McHargue, a pauper.

Same as to appropriation of \$40 a year to F. M. Whitley for the support of his son, a pauper.

In the matter of the petition of O. A. Mayhugh et al for a public road on the half section line between the ne qr of the nw qr of 32-56-19, near the residence of O. A. Mayhugh: The court finds that the requirements of sections 9414 and 9415 of the road law have been complied with, etc., and doth order O. G. Dameron, county surveyor, to survey and mark out said road, take relinquishment, right-of-way, etc., and file report with the clerk of this court on or before the 2nd day of the next term thereof.

Ordered that the order of this court, heretofore made, approving the contract by and between O. G. Dameron, bridge commissioner, and D. D. Knight for building a bridge across slough, near the residence of E. B. Grubbs, be and is set aside annulled for the reason that said D. D. Knight has failed to build said bridge.

Bond of J. W. Grizzell, county treasurer, presented, examined, approved, etc.

In the matter of drainage district No. 4: T. O. Stanley, civil engineer, presents engineer's estimate No. 9 for the Hummer Construction Co., which is approved and ordered filed. It is further ordered that a warrant in the sum of \$1,041.24, payable to the order of said Hummer Construction Co., issue on the construction fund of said drainage district, said sum being 25 per cent of the amount due said construction company on said estimate.

Same as to E. M. Graves in the sum of \$3,221.52.

Same as to R. H. McWilliams in the sum of \$2,720.95.

Account of T. O. Stanley, civil engineer of said drainage district No. 4, is allowed \$600 for three-months' services as such engineer. Judge R. T. Morehead enters protest against said allowance to said Stanley.

Account of J. A. Collet, services as attorney for said drainage district No. 4 in case of Wabash Railroad Co., appealed to the supreme court from assessment of benefits as per agreement, allowed in the sum of \$250.

Account of H. H. Miller in the sum of \$70.59 for fees due him by said drainage district No. 4 allowed.

In the matter of drainage district No. 5: O. G. Dameron, civil engineer, presents the account of Shaughnessy & Parker, contractors, in the sum of \$1,723.30 which is allowed.

Same as to account of O. G. Dameron, civil engineer, in the sum of \$48.

Same as to account of Shaughnessy & Parker, contractors, for drainage district No. 10 in the sum of \$765.95.

Same as to costs for location and construction expenses of drainage district No. 8 in the sum of \$478.22, said sum to be paid on or before March 1, 1907, and to bear six per cent interest from date.

Same as to account of E. Hubbard Hamilton for drainage district No. 6 in the sum of \$290, said sum to be paid on or before March 1, 1907, and to bear six

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per cent interest from September 24, 1906.

Same as to account of Theo. Persyn, John Hinrich, assignee, in the sum of \$190.40, said sum to bear six per cent interest from date until paid.

Same as to account of O. G. Dameron, civil engineer, in the sum of \$26, said sum to be paid on or before March 1, 1907, and to bear six per cent interest from date.

Same as to account of Theo. Persyn in the sum of \$628.52 to bear six per cent interest from date until paid.

Same as to account of H. H. Miller, county clerk, in the sum of \$8.79.

Same as to account of H. H. Miller in the sum of \$14.14 in drainage district No. 5.

Same as to bill of costs, etc., in the sum of \$775.55 in drainage district No. 10.

Same as to bill of costs in the sum of \$207.25 for cleaning ditch in drainage district No. 3.

Same as to bridge across branch, near the residence of W. M. Conrad.

Same as to bridge across slough, near the residence of R. G. Soush.

Same as to bridge on range line between 30-56-18 and 25-56-19.

Same as to bridge across Moxley branch, near the residence of Clarence McCurry.

Same as to bridge across south fork of Salt creek, near the residence of John Campbell.

Same as to bridge across branch, near the residence of Samuel Bowersmith.

Same as to bridge across Bee branch in Cockrell township on the Salisbury and Bynumville road.

Same as to bridge across slough, commonly called Hickman river, about 100 yards north of the center of 24-54-21.

Same as to bridge across Puzzle creek, near the residence of J. K. Earickson.

Same as to bridge across Puzzle creek, near the residence of Jos. Wangler.

Same as to bridge across Turkey creek on line between sections 9 and 16-56-20.

Same as to bridge on road dividing the e hf of the ne qr and e hf of the se qr of 13-54-17, near the residence of Guy Cox.

Same as to bridge across Willow branch on road from Snapp to Chraneville.

Same as to bridge across branch between 18-54-18 and 13-54-19, just north of the residence of C. H. Herring.

Same as to bridge across Dox-

ey creek, near the residence of Herman Nellesen.

Same as to bridge across Rock branch on range line between 16 and 17 on east line of 24-56-19.

Same as to bridge across Elm branch, near the residence of Gray Richmond.

Same as to two bridges across a branch running east and west between se qr 2 and ne qr 27-55-20.

Same as to bridge across Salt creek on Brunswick and Mendon road, near the residence of A. W. Williamson.

Bond of Chas. Parker as constable of Keytesville township in the sum of \$1,000 approved.

In the matter of the petition of Geo. F. Clark et al for a public road in 27 and 33-55-21: O. G. Dameron, commissioner, files report of the relinquishment of right-of-way, survey and plot, and, no damages being claimed, it is ordered that said road be and is established.

Ordered that 103.78 acres of swamp or overflowed lands in 33-53-19, formed by the recession of the Missouri river from its former course, and granted to Chariton county, be and the same are hereby sold to W. I. Kennel for \$25 an acre, and it appearing to the court that said Kennel is now and was, prior to the granting of said lands to the county, in possession of the same claiming them as his own, and had, prior to the 8th day of April, 1895, made lasting and valuable improvements on said lands to the amount of \$800, it is ordered that he be credited on the purchase price of said lands in the amount of \$800. The said Kennel presents to the court the receipt of J. W. Grizzell, county treasurer, showing that he has paid the sum of \$358.70 to the credit of the county school funds, and also files with the court his bond to the school funds in the sum of \$1,434.80, balance of purchase price, with J. A. Collet and W. G. Agee as securities, which said bond is examined, approved and ordered filed. It is further ordered that a certificate of purchase issue to said Kennel for said lands.

In the matter of drainage district No. 5: J. W. Grizzell allowed \$25 for delivering bonds and disbursing funds of said drainage district for 1906.

Same as to drainage district No. 6 in the sum of \$5 for services of said Grizzell in disbursing, 1905, tax.
