There was a bad wreck in the Wabash yards Friday. Two coal cars jumped the track. The cars were loaded heavily. The track was torn up considerably and the cars smashed, scattering the coal in every direction.

We are informed by the Brunswick that H. O. Benton, the efficient local agent for the Wabash at Brunswick, received word a few days ago from his niece, Miss Ethel Collins, at Wardner, Idaho, that she had won a handsome \$375 piano in a voting contest there. According to the Salisbury Press-Spectator, the Woodruff-Wright bridal party nearly came to grief in front of the P.-S. office Saturday night when they came in to take the 12:30 train. There were four in the carriage and the driver drove on the sand pile which is being used in the erection of the Dickson annex, overturning the vehicle and spilling the occupants out. The bride lost her watch, but it was found later and no one was hurt.

J. M. Bellamy of Sweet Springs fell into one of the big bins at his wheat elevator Thursday morning and in spite of strenuous efforts on the part of a large number of men, he met his death by suffocation. No one knows how Mr. Bellamy got into the bin, but various theories are advanced. It must have been that he was trying to start the wheat out and fall. He cried for help but sank below the surface of the wheat before help could reach him. Great holes were cut in the elevator to hasten the flow of the wheat out of the bin, but it was 25 minutes before Mr. Bellamy's body was recovered. Life was entirely extinct. Deceased was 63 years old.

## Crow and Hadley.

From the Palmyra Spectator.

Several of our exchanges have started a boom for Hon. E. C. Crow for governor. It was announced on seemingly good authority several months ago that Gen. Crow did not want the office, as it would too seriously interfere with the large practice he built up in St. Louis. He is good material for the place, however, and if the Republicans put up Hadley, who seems to be the only man they have to offer, his nomination would emphasize the old saw that comparisons are odious. Gen. Crow filled the office, Hadley is now rattling about in, for four years, and while he did not have a press agent to advertise him, his official record speaks for itself. It is very probable that there is no man in Missouri Hadley would rather not meet on the stump than Crow, for no man in Missouri would be better prepared to tell what Hadley has not done than Crow. While Crow was attorney-general he had only one assistant and his contingent expenses were only \$7,500 for a biennial period. He was elected on an anti-trust platform and without blow or outcry. On assuming the duties of his office he at once began to make his ante-election promises good by proceeding against the insurance and beef combines. The former trust was soon put out of business and the beef trust enriched the state treasury to the extent of nearly \$100,000. Crow did not stop at this, but before his term of office had expired had secured his salary and expenses aggregated, besides faithfully remaining at his post and attending to the routine work of his office. During Hadley's first two years of office holding he has had four assistants and his contingent expenses have amounted to \$70,000. Not one single trust has he busted and not one dollar has he collected in fines. And yet the Republicans say that on account of his phenomenal achievements he ought to be made governor of Missouri. When they are asked what he has done they take on a look of amazement at your ignorance and refer you to his great achievements in the Standard Oil prosecutions. But the Standard Oil trust is still doing business at the old stand and consumers are paying just as much for the products. Neither has it paid one cent in fines and the only result of the prosecution demonstrates that it is an unlawful combine which we all know before hand.
