An Automatic Recorder

For Ships The "navigraph" is the name given an invention by a Swedish engineer, which if it fulfills the claims of its originator, will prove of immense value to navigation.

It is a self-registering apparatus which continuously records all the data of a vessel's voyage. The apparatus automatically registers the vessel's speed, hour by hour and day by day; the

distance covered and the time consumed; the successive courses held during the voyage, how long each course was held, the distance traveled on each course or part thereof; the ship's position in longitude and latitude each day, and the force and direction of currents which tend to drive the vessel out of its course.—Popular Mechanics.
