Settle Wayland Case

The case of W. L. Wayland vs. The Western Life & Indemnity Co. is said to have been settled by the compromise route after a life in the court of about five years. The suit was for the amount of a policy carried by the late John Wayland of Salisbury which was tried in circuit court with a verdict for about \$5000 for Wayland. It was appealed to Kansas City affirmed and with a rehearing before the appeal late court was again affirmed. Owing to the division of the court of appeals in the affirmative decision it was placed before the Supreme Court for settlement where it is now pending. The Crossan case against the same company which is before the court of appeals was being held awaiting the decision of the supreme court in the Wayland case. The judgments in both cases, with interest accrued aggregate more than \$10,000.

Heber Hayes of east of this city bought a consignment of tobacco last week the first bought this season. The crop was raised last year and brought 5 cents the lb.

Twelve Silos

C. L. Hurd of Wainwright, Okla., was at the K. C. market and bought a bunch of 600 four-year-old steers to add to the 600 he now has on feed for the market. He has twelve silos with a capacity of 2500 tons of silage. He has these filled with kafir corn, kafir and cane and some with a little corn mixed in and in several, wheat or oats in dry form to absorb possible cane moisture. He says silage and cottonseed cake is the fattener. Speaking of low feed he recollects feeding 200 steers in Kansas years ago on corn that cost only 12 cents a bushel and sold them at \$3.80 per cwt. only to lose money. He thinks that ensilage and cottonseed spell success for feeders as feeding dry feed in the usual way is wasteful.
