Illinois Going Dry

Alexandria, La. June 7, 1865
John Spence Bret. of E. Company.

A. residing in Howard Co., Mo. having been with the approval of the proper authorities, paroled, is permitted to return to his home, not to be disturbed by the United States authorities, so long as he observes his parole and the laws in force where he may reside.

Muzzle the Horses

The danger lurking in dry corn fodder this year has caused the death of many horses that partook of the dry feed. Over in the edge of Grundy county last Friday C. C. Collins lost two valuable horses that had eaten of the fodder while the farmer was gathering corn. Another team also in the same field also took sick and their condition was serious for a time. Many similar cases have been reported, from various sections of North Missouri and as a precautionary measure it would be well enough to muzzle the horses while gathering corn. Corn that has been cut and shocked and cured in this manner, is said to be free from the deadly poison that lurks in the standing stalks.

Cinder in Your Eye

How frequently people hear the expression "I've got a cinder in my eye" especially when the air is filled with dust and smoke or about a railroad.

It may seem a trivial mishap and often is, if the foreign substance is immediately removed from the eye, yet it is often a most serious thing, and the public at large little realizes that a seemingly unimportant accident of this sort may result in serious if not permanent impairment of vision. The membrane covering the eyeball is a very delicate structure, and when even a tiny speck of any foreign matter lodges on it, quickly becomes imbedded. The irritation thus set up causes the person to wink the eye frequently, and each time the lid closes, rubbing against the particle, it tends to imbed it still further in the membrane. The efforts of sympathizing friends to remove the offending speck with a handkerchief or with a wooden toothpick instead of helping, sometimes results in making a bad matter worse; more damage can thus be done to the tissue. Infection is then easily carried deeper into the tissue and ulcer results. If the process reaches this stage, even if the particle is completely removed, it would perhaps be too late to prevent a scar after the ulcer heals. It might be so faint that it is hardly distinguishable, yet it is situated just in front of the pupil, and as very frequently happens, the vision of that eye would be seriously if not permanently impaired. In order that you understand the seriousness of such occurrences, we call your attention to it and recommend that you do not trifle with seemingly so unimportant a matter.
