## EUROPEAN WAR

Russian and German successes in the east. Allied fleet checked in Dardanelles, eight of their battleship being put out of action by Turks. No change in conditions in West.

## The Longer Range German Guns

The Scientific American in a recent war issued in a recent war issue told some facts that will astonish most of the war fans and make them realize that there was one other thing that they did not really know. It was a showing that the 8.2 inch naval guns of the Germans, mounted on their war vessels had a range greater than the 12 and 13 inch guns on the English vessels. The 8 inch German gun out ranges the 12 inch English gun by 3000 yards or a mile and a half and the 12 inch while carrying a lighter projectile, out ranges the 13 inch gun. The difference is due to the fact that the Germans mounted their turret and other guns so they could be elevated at the muzzle to an angle of 30 degrees while the English guns can be elevated only 15 degrees. This throws the muzzle of the German gun high enough so the German vessels could open fire with their 12-, 10 or 8.2-inch guns while still a

mile and a half out to range of the 12-inch guns of the English and all missiles would find a mark, so far as range is concerned. This was done primarily so that in case of a German vessel was hit below the water line and began sinking and listed to one side, the guns could be elevated enough to keep them fighting even while the vessel was leaning to one side. This foresight had the effect of increasing the range in ordinary fighting as well. The German 12-inch gun a board vessel has a range of 27,500 yards at 30-degree elevation and the British 12-inch at the 15-degree elevation (maximum) has a range of only 19,830 yards or 7,670 yards or 41-3 miles less.
