

**Chevrolet Ford Contest**

On Saturday, April 1, W. W. McCurdy Demonstrated a Chevrolet car in New Haven before a large crowd. During the Demonstration Theo Kuhn, the Ford agent, drove out a new Ford, but did not attempt the feats that Mr. McCurdy had the Chevrolet perform. After discussing the power of the two cars Mr. McCurdy and Mr. Kuhn agreed to hitch the rear ends of the two cars together and to pull for one minute. The Chevrolet had on smooth tires, while the Ford had on nonskid tires. Besides, Mr. Kuhn used his brakes to hold the Ford while speeding up his motor. Nevertheless, when the judge of the contest called "time" the Ford had been pulled about five feet to the rear. It was then agreed to put chains on the cars and to pull without the use of brakes. The Chevrolet displayed its wonderful power by spinning the wheels until the chain ground down to rock that was solid enough to hold, thus enabling it to drag off the Ford twice in succession. After the contest Mr. Kuhn drove the Chevrolet up to New Haven hills. Upon his return he acknowledged that he had the wrong idea of the "Chevrolet Four-Ninty." **A Big Spring**

**Intestinal Worms in Pigs**

Intestinal worms are common in hogs and are particularly injurious to growing pigs. Insufficiently fed, neglected pigs living in dirty pens and yards, fed from filthy troughs, drinking contaminated water, bathing in old hog wallows, and rooting and sleeping in manure piles and stack bottoms soon become infested with worms; consequently they do not thrive, but develop into pot-bellied, rickety, profitless runts. Pens should be kept clean and dry and the manure frequently removed.

It has been asserted by various experienced feeders of hogs that a mixture of charcoal, ashes, lime, salt, sulphur and copperas, kept where the hogs can eat it will tend to prevent worm infestation. There is not as yet positive experimental evidence in support of the idea that such a mixture will prevent worm infestation, but the mixture does appear to satisfy the hogs desire for mineral substances and probably is of value as a tonic and appetizer. It may be made up in the following proportions:

**Charcoal Mixture**

- Charcoal, 1 bushel.
  - Hardwood ashes, 1 bushel.
  - Salt, 8 pounds.
  - Air-slaked lime, 4 pounds.
  - Sulphur, 4 pounds.
  - Pulverized copperas, 2 pounds.
- Mix the lime, salt and sulphur thoroughly and then mix with the charcoal and ashes. Dissolve the copperas in two parts of hot water and sprinkle over the whole mass mixing it thoroughly. Keep some of this mixture in a box before the hogs at all times, or place in a self-feeder.

**Col. F. D. Gardner On River Improvements.**

"The manufacturing interests of Missouri are threatened with a complete loss of their Pacific Coast trade, owing to the fact that the Panama Canal has enabled the Eastern manufacturer to secure a rate by water of \$1.50 a hundredweight compared with a rate of \$3 per hundredweight from Missouri by rail. Therefore, it becomes absolutely imperative that the Mississippi and the Missouri rivers be made navigable and the levees built up. This, of course, is work for the Federal Government. Nevertheless, Missouri should start a propaganda so that our disadvantages may be exploited, and the necessity of making these rivers the servants of the people instead of their masters made so impressive that the Federal Government will be compelled to take action."


