Packers Deny Profiteering

Full page for small papers and proportionately for the larger ones appeared last week nearly all over the state an article written by the packers in an undertaking to annual in the public mind the report of the Trade Commission which, after an examination of the four principal packing institutions of the country, gave out that these four had made \$140,000,000 excess profits during the fiscal year ending June 1.

In the face of the fact that hogs on the hoof have sold for fifteen cts. to 20 cts. but largely around \$17.50 and pork has sold from 30 to 45 and bacon as high as 60 and boiled ham at 60 now, the statement puts it up to the local butchers and other meat handlers to explain if the packers are right, but the immense profit was round to exist among the packers themselves, no matter how much the local dealers had scooped in excess profit.

The millers of the country also come in for exposure. It was ordered that their profit, net, should not be in excess of 13 1/2 cts. a barrel, but it was discovered that they had cleaned up more than 52 cts. a barrel and then some had ninety five millions more profit than they were entitled to take. Also coal barrons are on the grill and it is said all will be required to dig up and turn over.


