The experience of Mr. Moses G. Williams of Chariton County, Missouri, with his winter wheat crop of 1918, is of particular interest. To a part of his field he applied, with a grain drill having a fertilizer attachment, 200 pounds to the acre of Empire fertilizer, while an adjoining part of the field was left without fertilizer.

A photograph of this field made on May 10th shows a wonderful difference in favor of the fertilized wheat. The growth was much larger, the stand better, and the plants were more vigorous in every way. The ground was completely covered where the fertilizer was used, whereas on the other side of the field the ground could be seen plainly between the rows, and the wheat looked weak and


