A bill has been introduced in congress by representative Martin L. Davey of Ohio, doubtless from a district affected by or replete with labor unions, the provisions of which bill might be tolerably good or intolerably bad. Evidently the purpose of the bill is to frame a law to control or exterminate labor unions, but how it might be construed if enacted, no living man, the author included, can guess. From the language of the bill we gather that its purport is to protect the Union from seditiously inclined persons, natives, adopted or aliens, but we have always had the impression that the constitution amply provides for that and the proceedings against those charged with violation of federal laws in any degree, it seems to us would justify the impression, even at this time and under existing circumstances. Too many whose environments or constituents color their views of what constitutes Americanism if not blind them to common human rights, are appearing with storm ingredients in their proposals for control of labor in ways by which labor will not be coerced.
