

Dead From Fall.

Robert L. Sasse of Brunswick, known to nearly all in the county, died at a hospital in Kansas City, July 21 aged 45 years and 21 days. He had gone to the hospital some time ago for treatment for mental and physical trouble and a few weeks ago leaped from a window and sustained injuries which proved fatal.

He is survived by his mother, two sisters and two brothers. His mother conducted the Florence hotel at Brunswick for a number of years and after the death of her husband in 1881, Bob, her son, as he was known to nearly every acquaintance, assisted her and she was his main care always. He gained an enviable reputation in the life insurance world and had many souvenirs conferred on him for his success in the business.

Bob Sasse advanced steadily in his business because of his courteous way and square dealing. He was popular in society from early boyhood as well as in business circles and his ambition urging him to incessant and hard work perhaps account for the early breakdown.

Funeral services were conducted July 23 by Rev. Walther at the Lutheran church of which the deceased was a member and interment in the Lower cemetery, the pall bearers being from among his Masonic brethren.
