**Acquitted in 20 Minutes**

Denny Chester was charged with the murder of Florence Barton in Kansas City, pursued and brot back to Kansas City from Broken Bow, Neb. for trial. Thousands of dollars were expended by the state and friends of the defendant in the case and when submitted to a jury for decision last Saturday, it required but 20 minutes to render a verdict of not guilty.
