## POLICE CONFISCATED STILL HERE SATURDAY

Chief of Police Jerry Mize and two of his men, John Frazier and Charles Hughes, and Deputy Sheriff Harry Polson went to the home of Joseph E. Johnson, 328 North Fourth street, yesterday evening about 7:00 o'clock Saturday night and searched the place. In the basement of the home the following articles were found:

A quantity of white corn whisky; five barrels of corn mash, one complete still, capable of holding between twenty and thirty gallons; three copper kettles, one barrel of water, one copper coil, two gas stoves, thirty feet of rubber hose, several buckets, two kegs, some jugs, four tubs, one demijohn, one bag of sugar and a quantity of bottles.

All of the above were taken to the store room at the courthouse. A warrant was issued from Circuit Clerk C. M. Hulen's office and last night Johnson was released on a \$3,000 bond to appear in court March 30.

Last night officers poured a quantity of the white corn on the floor of the courthouse lobby. A lighted match was touched to it and it burned with a pretty blue flame until it was all consumed.

This is the first quantity of corn liquor to be taken by officers in this county officers said last night. The officers met with no opposition in searching the house. The Johnsons did not make and protest against the house being searched.—Moberly Democrat.

## AND IN CHILLICOTHE, TOO

Arrests for making or selling intoxicants in Chillicothe and Livingston county are coming in with such regularity of late that they probably will soon cease to be of real news value.

The 14th arrest was made Tuesday afternoon about 5 o'clock when Sheriff Ross Diehl, armed with a search warrant, entered the home of Earl Haley, corner Third and Brunswick streets, and confiscated a still, a quantity of corn mash, and a quantity of home-made whisky, according to Sheriff Diehl's statement Wednesday. Haley is married and has four children.

Haley has been unable to give a bond at noon Wednesday and remained in the custody of the sheriff.

The arrest of Haley was the 14th made by the officers in their drive to suppress the making and selling of intoxicants in this city. Of this number five have plead guilty and have been fined or sentenced; one was convicted before a jury and in case Haley stands trial, eight will be docketed for trial before the April term of the circuit court.—Chillicothe Tribune.
