SANTA FE TRADERS, and those desirous of crossing the plains to New Mexico, are informed that the undersigned will carry the United States Mail from Independence to Santa Fe, for four weeks, commencing on the first day of July next, and continuing for six weeks.

These stages will leave Independence and Santa Fe on the first of each month. They will be entirely new, and comfortable for passengers; will be supplied with provisions through, each way, in from twenty to twenty-five days. Travelers to and from New Mexico will doubtless find this the safest, most expeditious and comfortable, as well as the cheapest mode of crossing the plains.

### FARE.

From November 1st to May 1st, \$150.  
From May 1st to November 1st, \$125.  
Provisions, arms, and ammunition furnished by the Proprietors.

Packages and extra baggage will be transported, when possible to do so, at the rate of 25 cents per pound in the summer, and 40 cents in the winter, but no package will be charged less than one dollar.

The proprietor will not be responsible for any baggage worth more than fifty dollars, unless consigned and specially contracted for, and all baggage at all times at the risk of the owner thereof.

In all cases, the passage money must be paid in advance, and passengers must stipulate to conform to the rules which may be established by the undersigned for the government of their line of stages, and these traveling with them on the stage.
