A WORD RERTONAL.

Mr. Bittinger's signed statement in yesterday's Evening Star makes a few remarks from me necessary.

He says that the reason he opposed my candidacy in the Times-Union and Citizen's contest was because of my "unmanly, disreputable and dishonorable treatment of the Florida Press Association."

Those who know me are aware that such conduct is not natural to me. They know it is a false appendage.

I have been a member of the Florida Press Association since its organization, and at every meeting I have ever attended have been shown the the most distinguished consideration, and at the meetings I did not attend feel sure the association has accorded me the same treatment, with, perhaps, the exception of one or two members.

We must expect to find one or two black sheep in every fold.

At Fernandina, twenty years ago, at Jacksonville, at Key West and other places, I was on the programme for one of the principal orations.

At the meeting at Miami this year I again figured on the programme, was elected editor-in-chief of the Composite Bulletin, the first effort in that direction by the Association, and was shown other marks of distinguished respect.

In throwing these bouquets at me I was not aware until now that the Association was heaping coals of fire on the head of C. L. Bittinger.

What he says about the efforts of the Association to expel me for violating its rules is news to me, indeed!

Never a breath of it has reached my ears before.

Some years ago, Mr. Bittinger, acting for the Ocala Star, Mr. Carroll for the Baptist Witness, Mr. Brumby for the Marion Free Press, and Mr. McDonald for the Ocala Banner, signed a written agreement that they would not print a certain class of advertising except for a certain price.

Mr. Bittinger almost immediately violated that obligation.

Mr. McDonald and Mr. Brumby said then that they would make affidavits to that effect, and I suppose both gentlemen will still do so.

I threatened to report Bittinger's conduct to the State Press Association at the Myers meeting, but did not attend said meeting, and hence did not bring the matter before it.

Mr. Bittinger may have taken advantage of my absence and endeavored to work up a feeling against me. It is not unlike him to have done so.

I took C. L. Bittinger into my employment, confidence and home when he scarcely had a dollar.

For twelve years he had almost sole control of the business end of this newspaper.

It was during the prosperous era of this state. It then required little business sagacity to make any business prosperous.

He swore devotion, loyalty and undying friendship to me—personal and political.

After the bank failures, when the outlook had a leaden cast, without consultation or a word of warning, or a settlement except what he made with himself, he left my office for Asheville, N. C., where he bought a half interest in a republican newspaper and under his own signature promptly espoused the principles of the republican party.

Mr. T. J. Appleyard, secretary of the State Press Association, and editor of the Sanford Chronicle, and some other Florida newspapers, made a note of his apostasy.

He left my books in a shape that no mortal man can unravel.

Since his return he has persistently refused to give any assistance in righting them, and since the day he walked out of it, has never put his foot inside this office.

Perhaps he feels too mean to do so. The meanest dog of the meanest breed is not entirely conscienceless.

It may be asked why those twelve years of trusted friendship?




