


Mr. Long and the State Fair.
To the Editor of the Banner:
MARTELL, FLA., Oct. 15, 1901.
As so many wish to know how I am succeeding in securing exhibits for the state fair, I ask space in your valuable paper for the following statement as a part of what has been accomplished:
I have secured an exhibit of oranges, tangerines, mandarines, grape fruit, and limes from Mr. Charles Schneider, near the Taylor plantation.
Commissioner Wartmann will send a good citrus exhibit from Citra.
Orange Lake, McIntosh and Boardman will be well to the front. Lake Weir and other localities, yet to hear from.
Six progressive men and one woman representing each an election district are competing for the best collective agricultural exhibit.
Ocala's three cotton buyers will each send a bale of fine cotton.
Mr. Bogau will furnish a splendid hard wood exhibit.
The Ocala Foundry will furnish two samples of its castings.
Taylor Bros., and others will furnish samples of vegetable crates, carriers, baskets and barrels.
The progressive firm of Ford & Hiller are trying to solve the problem of getting a three-ton phosphate rock to Jacksonville, and while they may fail in that, still they will have on hand a splendid exhibit of phosphate.
Mr. Faunett, who is always found well to the front, will furnish samples of boiled grits and meal, crushed feed of various kinds, rice, etc., and he and that up-to-date progressive lady, Miss Jessie Owens, will compete for the biggest cotton stalk.
The ladies are doing well in getting up a splendid exhibit in the woman's department.
A lady of Martel has discovered a fine lot of guavas upon a tract of land recently purchased by her in that vicinity and will bring them prominently to the front. They are the result of the efforts of Mrs. Geo. J. Ross.
Thos. W. Cooper will be well to the front with a pig now weighing three hundred pounds, which he says he will make weigh four hundred pounds by the opening of the state fair.
W. A. Hobbs, of Orange Springs, will trot out a well formed razorback hog that has six legs.
Another gentleman who never does things by halves will produce a calf that has two perfectly developed heads, two tails, one body and seven legs.
The poor farm will have on hand a pinder vine that is eight feet in diameter in connection with a good collective agricultural exhibit.
Space will not permit giving credit to exhibitors of brooms, ax handles, cream separators, kumquats in boxes, Belgian hares, poultry and numerous other things that will be on exhibit in Marion's department, and last, but not least, cold storage hams and other meats.
Let everybody come heroically to the front and aid me in this, perhaps my last effort, to bring creditably to the front Marion county among her sister counties, remembering that those who aid me help their county and those who help their county help themselves.
I am just informed by Maj. G. P. Healey, general manager state fair of Florida, that the following arrangements have been consummated with railroad officials and the express company:
All county exhibits will be brought to Jacksonville free.
Private exhibits will be charged for at regular rates to Jacksonville and returned free.
All exhibits returned will be charged for at regular rates.
The Southern Express Company will carry all exhibits to Jacksonville free to the amount of 150 pounds per exhibit and return at regular rates.
The owners of all exhibits are at liberty to sell the same at the close of the fair.
The passenger rate for round trip tickets are fixed at one and a half cents per mile each way. Tickets will be sold November 18th to November 22nd, to be good until November 24.
I appeal to every progressive man and woman in Marion county to give me their aid and support, so as to make our exhibit a success that we all will be proud of.
I appreciate the courtesies of the railroad and express officials above stated. I am doing all I can to secure some others and hope to succeed.
