The tax payers would like to know if the two roads leading from Flemington to Micanopy have been taken off the county as they have not been worked for more than a year. Some places are almost impassable. We pay as much road tax as any other section of the county and should have better roads. Every farmer around here has his corn crib and smoke house full of corn and bacon, especially those who raise their hogs in pastures. They find the pasture system the best and cheapest way. They have plenty of bacon and lard to sell and find better sales for the pasture raised meat. One farmer from a five acre summer pasture last season killed 1500 pounds pork and got a barrel of lard. Raised pinders to fatten the hogs, which every farmer can do.
