THE REASON WHY

To the Voters of Marion County:
There have been a number of objections made against calling the wet or dry election.
We wish to state that the law forbids the election being held at the same time as a general election. As to the expense of the election, two years ago, the total cost did not exceed \$600, and there was \$1285 extra polls paid that year—1905—while there was only \$364 extra polls paid in the year 1904. This shows that there were \$921 polls paid in order to vote for or against prohibition, which would not have been paid if we had not had the election. Thereby this county made \$221. These figures are taken from the records.

We also want to say that not one cent of the whiskey tax goes to the schools of the county. Not one cent goes to build hard roads, not one cent goes to pay for the new court house, and not one cent goes to pensions. There are special levies for all of these purposes and whether the county goes wet or dry, these levies will be the same.
