Ordinance No. 49

An ordinance to amend Section Two of Ordinance number 31 of the City of Williston, entitled, An Ordinance Regulating Billiard Rooms and Bowling alleys.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Williston, north Dakota: That Section Two of Ordinance Number 31 of the City of Williston be and the same is amended to read as follows: LICENSE. HOW OBTAINED, TERM OF, AMOUNT OF. Any person desiring to obtain such license shall present a written or printed application therefor to the City Treasurer of said City, stating therein the kind of tables, or for what said license is applied for and designating the place or room in which such tables or alleys are to be kept, and upon paying the said City Treasurer the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) per year or at that rate from the time of application made for the balance of the term of such license, for each billiard or pool room; and the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per month in like manner as aforesaid for each and every Bowling or Ten-pin alley so kept shall receive from the said Treasurer his receipt therefor stating the amount paid at the date of application asked for, for what paid, and designating the place in which said tables or Bowling Alleys are to be kept, and upon presentation thereof to the City Auditor said applicant shall receive license therefor stating the articles for which it is granted, the room where it is to be kept, and to whom granted, the period for which it is granted, the amount paid, and such license shall terminate on the first day of January next succeeding the date of such license. Such license shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the City Auditor with the Corporate Seal attached, and shall not be transferable.

SECTION 2. This amended ordinance shall take effect and be enforced from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.

Regular session of the city council met at the council room Monday evening Oct. 1st, 1906 at 8 o'clock.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Wegley.

Minutes of meeting of Sept. 24th read and approved.

Motion made and carried that the city Auditor order 384 feet more of 8 inch pipe.

Ordinance No. 49 entitled "An Ordinance to amend sec 2 of ordinance No. 31" introduced and upon motion made and carried placed upon its first reading and formally read.

Complaint having been filed to the effect that parties running water wagons were taking water from the slough for building purposes and using the same tank for domestic supply and in consequence thereof the water used in the families were infected and contained impurities which had caused sickness in the community.

Motion made and carried that the Chief of Police be instructed to at once notify such parties thus furnishing water to disinfect the tank used for domestic purposes and refrain from using them for slough water and that all tanks be labeled so as to inform the users of water that the tank was clean and not used for the slough water.

No further business appearing before the council, meeting adjourned till Monday evening Oct. 8th at 8 o'clock.
