## DEMOCRATS NAME JOHN A. JOHNSON

MINNESOTA STATE DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE NAMES HIM FOR PRESIDENCY.

He is Endorsed by a Vote of 68 to 23 After a Very Interesting Contest—The Bryan Adherents Show Considerable Strength.

St. Paul, March 7.—Resolutions endorsing Gov. Johnson for the Democratic nomination for president were adopted by the Democratic state central committee yesterday afternoon by a vote of 23 to 68, just a two-thirds vote of the entire membership of the committee which is 102.

The governor took no action and did not appear himself. The matter was managed and arranged by Secretary Frank A. Day and other close political friends, and necessarily carries the governor's acquiescence.

It was an interesting battle, for both sides contested every point, both sides being determined to make as good a showing as possible. It be-

gan with a fight on the proxies presented by men on both sides and continued, when the resolutions were presented, with an eloquent and earnest debate, which lasted two hours, and ended with a roll call, in which the Bryan men lost out, 68 to 23. All in all, it was one of the most interesting and best attended meetings a state central committee has ever held in this state.

That the Bryan men were able to muster twenty-three votes was really more than the Johnson men expected. They did not look for more than ten or a dozen. Several of them were votes of men who had proxies of members, though most of the proxies voted as the men they represented would have voted.

Neither side at any time had any doubt as to the result. It was only a fight to show the outside world whether Johnson or Bryan had most friends in Minnesota. Both sides had worked hard to get as many of their men present as possible, and there were few of the members who were not represented. Every question presented, almost, was decided by the same vote.

St. Paul won out over Minneapolis in the fight for the state convention, the Bryan men favoring Minneapolis. The date, May 14, was fixed by a unanimous vote, but the apportionment was fixed by the divided vote.

The resolution is as follows: Gov. John A. Johnson has twice brought victory to the democracy of Minnesota. During his incumbency of the office of governor more reform has been instituted and more remedial legislation adopted than before in the history of our state.

Confidently believing that his nomination as candidate of the party for the presidency, will bring to our support the electoral votes of the states in the Mississippi valley and thus secure a national triumph, we respectfully present to the democracy of the nation the name of John A. Johnson as candidate for presidency of the United States, and recommend to the Democrats of Minnesota that they cause his name to be presented to national convention at Denver for nomination.

The committee ruled out James Mahan who held the proxy of A. B. Clair of Grand Rapids. Mr. Mahan is recognized as Bryan's personal representative.

Hear Robbers; Go to Sleep.

La Crosse, March 7.—Postoffice Inspector E. E. Fraser of La Crosse, who has just returned from Bay City, Minn., after an unsuccessful hunt for the burglars who dynamited the safes of that and adjoining cities a few nights ago, says persons living over the postoffice and general store told him that they heard the explosions of dynamite, but thought it was a screen door banging in the wind.
